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## Autumn Red Wrap with Flower

The deep bold red color of this wrap is perfect for the fall season. It's great to wear for holidays and it'll keep you nice and warm. The flower pin makes it a girly crochet pattern, an easy crochet pattern too.



**Crochet Hook:** K/10.5 or 6.5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

Find tons of free crochet patterns, tips and tutorials at [AllFreeCrochet.com](http://AllFreeCrochet.com).

- Caron International's Simply Soft (100% acrylic; 6 oz/170 g, 315 yds/288 m): #9730 Autumn Red (A), 2 skeins (for Wrap and Flower), #9742 Grey Heather (B), 2 skeins.
- One size US K/10.5 (6.5 mm) crochet hook for Wrap. One size US 7 (4.5 mm) crochet hook for Flower
- Tapestry needle (tn), Five 4mm round dark grey beads, for Flower, Sewing thread and needle, for Flower, Pin back – 1 1/4" long, for Flower
- Note: Hold one strand of each color together throughout for Wrap; use single strand for Flower.

**GAUGE:** Not critical for this project

### SPECIAL TERMS:

V-st: Work [dc, ch 1, dc] in next st.

### STITCHES USED:

Chain (ch), Double crochet (dc), Half double crochet (hdc), Single crochet (sc), Treble crochet (tr). Three and Two Stitch (multiple of 6 sts + 2; 2 row repeat) Work base chain.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Foundation Row (RS):** Beg in fifth ch from hook, work V-st in fifth ch, \* skip 2 ch, work 3 dc in next ch, skip 2

ch, work V-st in next ch; rep from \* across to last 5 ch, skip 2 ch, work 3 dc in next ch, skip 1 ch, dc in last ch, turn.

**Row 1:** Ch 3, \*skip 2 sts, work 3 dc in center of dc-3 of previous row, work V-st in ch-1 space of V-st of previous row; rep from \* across, end dc in top of turning ch, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, \*work Vst in ch-1 space, 3 dc in center of next dc-3; rep from \* across, end dc in top of turning ch, turn. Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for Three and Two st.

**NOTE:** Wrap is worked from end to end.

### WRAP

**Base Chain:** Using 1 strand of each color held together, chain 22. (RS) Beg Three and Two st; work even for 15 rows, counting Foundation Row.

**Shape Sides:** Cont as est, inc one pattern (V-st or dc-3) at beg and end of this row, then every other row twice—3 patterns increased each side; place a marker (pm) each side. Work even until piece measures 30" from markers; pm each side.

**Shape Sides:** Cont as est, dec one pattern (V-st or dc-3) at beg and end of this row, then every other row twice—3 patterns decreased each side. Work even until piece measures

same as first end to markers. Fasten off.

### FINISHING

**Edging – Shaped sides:** Join 1 strand each color with a slip st to corner of base ch; work Shell st evenly along shaped side as follows: Ch 1, \* work 3 dc, sc; rep from \* to opposite end.

**Edging - Ends:** Join 2 strands A with a slip st to corner of one end; work Picot edging as follows:

**Row 1:** Ch 2, \* hdc, ch 1; rep from \* across end, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, \* sc in next st, [ch 3, slip st in third ch from hook (picot made)]; rep from \* across, end sc in last st. Fasten off. Using tn, weave in all ends.

### FLOWER PIN:

Chain 2.

**Rnd 1:** Beg in the second ch from hook, work 8 sc in second ch; join with a slip st to form a ring.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, work 2 sc in each sc around; join with slip st to first st—16 sc.

**Rnd 3:** Working in front loop only of each sc of Rnd 2, ch 5 (counts as sc, ch

4), \* slip st in next st, ch 4; rep from \* around, join with a slip st to first ch of beg ch-5—16 loops.

**Rnd 4:** Working in back loop of each sc of Rnd 2, ch 1, sc in each st around, join with slip st to first st—16 sc.

**Rnd 5:** Working in front loop of each sc of Rnd 4, \* ch 4, dc in next st, ch 4, slip st in same st, slip st in next st; rep from \* around, join with a slip st to first ch of beg ch-4.

**Rnd 6:** Slip st in back loop of first sc of Rnd 4, \* [ch 5, tr in same st, ch 5, slip st in same st], slip st in next st; rep from \* around.

Fasten off.

#### **FINISHING:**

Using tn, weave in all ends.

**Attach Beads:** With WS facing, using sewing needle and matching thread, attach thread to center of flower. \* Insert needle through center of flower to RS, thread on first bead, bring needle and thread to WS; rep from \* for each bead, forming a circle of beads in the center of the flower, using photo as a guide. Sew pin back to center of flower on WS.

#### **CARE INSTRUCTIONS:**

**Hand Washing And Drying:** Turn inside out and wash gently in warm water using a mild detergent.

Gently rinse well in cold water. Lay flat on a towel and roll in towel to

remove excess water. DO NOT WRING, STRETCH OR HANG TO DRY.

**Handling Instructions:** When using the yarn, be sure to tie a knot at the beginning of each skein and at both yarn ends when joining. A small amount of shedding can be expected when using this yarn under normal conditions.

**Crochet Hook:** I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Bernat® Satin (100 g/3.5 oz; 149 m/163 yds)  
2 balls each of:  
A: #04013 Mocha  
B: #04018 Buff  
C: #04521 Amber  
D: #04435 Cameo  
E: #04531 Rouge

- Crochet Hook: size 5.5 mm (U.S. I or 9) or size needed to obtain gauge.

### Measurements:

Approx 24 x 70 ins [61 x 178 cm]

### Gauge:

13 sc and 14 rows = 4 ins [10 cm]

Stripe Pat: Work 2 rows of each color in following sequence: A, B, C, A, D, E. These 12 rows form Stripe Pat.

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Note:** Shawl is worked widthwise.

With A, ch 227.

**1st row:** (RS). 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. 226 sc. Turn.

**2nd and alt rows:** Ch 2 (does not count as st). 1 hdc in each st to end of row. Join B. Turn.

First 2 rows of Stripe Pat are completed.

**3rd row:** With B, ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 3 hdc. \*(Pulling long loop, 1 sc in next foundation ch two rows below – long sc made) twice. 1 sc in each of next 2 hdc. Rep from \* to last 3 hdc. 1 sc in each of last 3 hdc. Turn.



**5th row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in first hdc. \*Long sc in each of next 2 hdc two rows below. 1 sc in each of next 2 hdc. Rep from \* ending with 1 sc in last hdc. Join C. Turn.

**7th row:** With C, ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 3 hdc. \*Long sc in each of next 2 hdc two rows below. 1 sc in each of next 2 hdc. Rep from \* to last 3 hdc. 1 sc in each of last 3 hdc. Turn.

**8th row:** As 2nd row joining A at end of row.

Keeping cont of Stripe Pat, rep 5th to 8th rows for pat until work from beg measures approx 24 ins [61 cm], ending with a WS row. Fasten off.

**FINISHING:**

With RS facing join A with sl st to left corner of side edge. Work in sc across side edge of Shawl. Fasten off. Rep across other side.

## A Soft Comfy Poncho for Fall

It's the perfect time to make a Soft Comfy Poncho for Fall. Use this free crochet pattern from Berta Gilholm. She uses a Gala yarn in an Olive/Yellow color and the basic crochet stitches; this is an easy to intermediate crochet pattern.

**Crochet Hook:** I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (3) Light/DK (21-24 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Gala yarns, 100% Polyester, 50 gr. 1.76 oz., DK weight, 104 yds Olive/Yellow Multi 3 balls

- Crochet hook, 6.00 mm (US 10/I)
- Yarn needle

### Stitches Used/Abbreviations:

Ch= chain

Sc= single crochet

Dc= double crochet

Tr= triple crochet

Slst= slip stitch.

Rnd=round

### Sizes:

One size, fits most woman.

Approximately 26 inches long with fringe x 44 inches wide at widest point.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

Ch 71, be careful not to twist chain and join to form a circle, (work in rounds)

**Rnd 1:** Sc in second ch from hook, sc in each ch to end of rnd. (70 sc) join rnd with a sl st in the beginning ch, mark this slst with a safety pin or clip.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in first 13 sc, 2 sc in next sc (increase made), \*sc in next 13 sc, 2 sc in next sc (increase made), repeat from \* 3 more times, (75 sc) join rnd with a sl st in the beginning ch.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in first 6 sc, 2 dc in next sc (increase

made), \*dc in next 6 sc, 2 dc in next sc (increase made), repeat from \* 8 more times, dc in last 5 sc (85 dc) join rnd with a slst top of the beginning ch.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in same space (increase made) dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc (increase made), \*dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc (increase made), repeat from \* 12 more times, dc in last dc (100 dc) join rnd with a slst in top of the beginning ch.

**Rnd 5:** Ch 4 (counts as first Tr + Ch 1 set), tr, ch 1 in same space as ch 4 (increase made), 1 tr in next dc, ch 1, skip dc (4 times), \*tr in the next dc, ch 1 skip dc (9 times) 1 tr, ch 1, 1 tr, ch1 in next dc (increase made), repeat from\* 8 times, 1 tr in next dc, ch 1, skip dc (5 times), join rnd with a sl st in 3rd ch of the beginning ch, (110 stitches – 55 Tr + 55 Ch 1) Repeat round 5 for pattern with the following increases for each row:

**Rnd 6:** Keep to pattern add 14 (Tr/Ch 1 sets) evenly spaced around, (total 124/ 62 tr/ 62 ch)

**Rnd 7:** Keep to pattern add 16 (Tr/Ch 1 sets) evenly spaced around, (total 140/ 70 tr/ 70 ch)

**Rnd 8:** Keep to pattern add 16 (Tr/Ch

1 sets) evenly spaced around, (total 156/ 78 tr/ 78 ch)

**Rnd 9:** Keep to pattern add 20 (Tr/Ch 1 sets) evenly spaced around, (total 176/ 88 tr/ 88 ch)

**Rnd 10:** Keep to pattern add 22 (Tr/Ch 1 sets) evenly spaced around, (total 198/ 99 tr/ 99 ch)

**Rnd 11:** Keep to pattern add 24 (Tr/Ch 1 sets) evenly spaced around, (total 222/ 111 tr/ 111 ch)

**Rnd 12 - 20:** Keep to pattern working - Ch 4 (counts as first Tr + Ch 1 set), 1Tr/Ch 1 in every other tr around, join rnd with a slst in 3rd ch of the beginning ch, (222 stitches/111 Tr/111 Ch 1), Do not fasten off.

**Rnd 21:** \*Ch 10, skip next (ch 1, Tr, ch1) sc in next tr, Repeat all the way around, join rnd with a slst in first ch of the beginning ch, fasten off, weave in ends.

#### **FLOWER BROOCH:**

With 2 strands held together and leaving a 5" loose tail, Ch 2, slst in 2nd ch from hook, (small ring made)

**Rnd 1:** Work 8 sc in ring, join with slst to first sc,

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc, join with slst to first sc, join to first sc with slst (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, 1 hdc in same st, 2 dc in next sc, hdc - sl st in next sc, \*Ch 1 - 1 hdc in next sc, 2 dc in next sc, hdc - sl st in next sc, repeat from \* around, (5 flower petals), join to first sc with a slst, Fasten off and leave a 5" loose tail.

**CENTER OF FLOWER:**

Pull both the beginning and ending tails through center of flower so they lay in the back. Sew a  $\frac{3}{4}$ " to 1" decorative antique type button to the center of the flower and weave the tails through the 2nd and 3rd row of the poncho a few times, knot behind flower and trim leaving some of the tail hanging loose.

## Broomstick Lace Shawl

This free crochet pattern is made in broomstick lace which gives it a nice textured look. The floral motif border really adds a nice embellishment. It's perfect for fall evenings.



**Crochet Hook:** H/8 or 5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

**Materials:**

- Yarn: Caron International's Simply Soft (100% acrylic; 6 oz/170 g, 315 yds/288 m

skein): #9722 Plum Wine, 3 skeins

- One crochet hook size US H-8 (5 mm), or size to obtain gauge
- Size 35 (19 mm) knitting needle
- Yarn needle

### Finished Measurements:

Shawl measures approximately 61"/155 cm wide (at top edge, widest point) x 27"/68.5 cm long;

Shawl Base (without motif strip) measures approximately 53"/134.5 cm (at top edge, widest point) x 20"/51 cm long

### Gauge:

In single crochet (worked in front loops only), using US H-8 (5 mm) hook, 11 sts and 8 rows = 3"/7.5 cm;

Each completed motif measures 4"/10 cm.

### Stitches Used:

Chain (ch)  
Double crochet (dc)  
Single crochet (sc)  
Treble crochet (tr)

### Special Terms:

**sc2tog:** Single crochet 2 together – Insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, (two loops on hook), insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over and draw through all three loops on hook.

**Notes:**

The shawl includes rows of Broomstick (Jiffy) lace. There are two steps in working Broomstick lace. First, loops of stitches are extended and placed on a large knitting needle (the broomstick). Next the loops are worked off the needle with single crochet.

In Broomstick lace, there are many different ways to hold the large knitting needle. Experiment with different grips and placement of the large knitting needle to find a position that works for you.

**SHAWL:**

**Base**

Ch 4.

**Row 1:** Sc in second ch from hook and in each remaining ch across, turn—3 sc.

**Row 2 (RS):** Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in each st to last st, 2 sc in last st, turn—4 sc.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, turn, sc in second ch from hook; working in front loops only, sc in each sc across, turn—5 sc.

**Rows 4 and 5:** Work Rows 2 and 3—7 sc.

**Row 6 (opening loops):** Hold knitting needle close to work. Extend loop on

hook slightly and place on knitting needle. \*Working in front loops only, insert hook in next sc, yarn over and draw up a loop, extending the loop slightly place loop on the knitting needle; repeat from \* to last sc; insert hook in front loop of last sc, yarn over and draw up a loop, place loop on the knitting needle, insert hook in back loop of last sc, yarn over and draw up a loop, place loop on the knitting needle, turn—8 loops on needle.

**Row 7 (closing loops):** Working loosely, insert hook in first loop on knitting needle, yarn over and draw up a loop; ch 1, 2 sc in same loop; remove loop from knitting needle, \*sc in next loop on knitting needle, remove loop from knitting needle; repeat from \* until all loops are removed from knitting needle, turn—9 sts.

**Row 8 (RS):** Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in each st to last st, 2 sc in last st, turn—10 sc.

**Row 9:** Ch 2, turn, sc in second ch from hook; working in front loops only, sc in each sc across, turn—11 sc.

**Rows 10–69:** Repeat 4–9 ten times—71 sc.

**Row 70:** Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc2tog, turn—70 sts.

**Row 71:** Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc2tog, sc in each remaining st across, turn—69 sts.

**Row 72:** Hold knitting needle close to work. Extend loop on hook slightly and place on knitting needle.

\*Working in front loops only, insert hook in next sc, yarn over and draw up a loop, extending the loop slightly place loop on the knitting needle; repeat from \* to last sc; leave last sc unworked, turn—68 loops on needle.

**Row 73 (closing loops):** Working loosely, insert hook into first 2 loops on knitting needle at the same time, yarn over and draw up a loop; ch 1, inserting hook into first 2 loops at the same time, work 1 sc; remove loops from knitting needle, \*sc in next loop on knitting needle, remove loop from knitting needle; repeat from \* until all loops are removed from knitting needle, turn—67 sts.

**Row 74:** Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in each st across to last 2 sc, sc2tog, turn—66 sts.

**Row 75:** Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc2tog, sc in each remaining st across, turn—65 sts.

**Rows 76 and 77:** Repeat Rows 74 and 75—63 sts.

**Rows 78–137:** Repeat Rows 72–77 ten times—3 sts.

**Row 138:** Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in first st, sc2tog—1 st. Fasten off.

### Edging

With WS facing and point facing upwards, join yarn with slip st in lower side corner.

**Row 1:** Ch 1, working along lower edge of shawl base, work 133 sc evenly spaced to point of shawl, 2 sc in point, work 133 sc evenly spaced to opposite corner of shawl base—268 sc. Fasten off.

### MOTIF (make 19)

Ch 4; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring.

**Round 1:** Ch 1, work 7 sc in ring; join with slip st in first sc.

**Round 2:** Ch 8, slip st in same st as join, \*(slip st, ch 8, slip st) in next sc; repeat from \* 6 more times; (sl st, ch 4, tr) in first sc (at base of beginning ch-8).

**Round 3:** Ch 1, sc in space formed by last st of previous round, ch 2, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-8 space, ch 2, \*sc in next ch-8 sp, ch 2, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-8 sp, ch 2; repeat from \* 2 more times; join with slip st in first sc.

**Round 4:** Ch 1, sc in same st as join, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 dc, (2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 dc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, \*sc in next sc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 dc, (2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 dc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* 2 more times; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

### Assemble Motif Strip

Arrange motifs according to assembly diagram. Using yarn needle, whipstitch motifs together.

### FINISHING

Join Base and Motif Strip

With WS facing, join yarn with slip st in inner corner of first motif of strip.

**Row 1:** Hold piece to work along inner v-edge of motif strip; ch 1, working along inner edge of motif strip, work 268 sc evenly spaced across inner edge to opposite corner of motif strip, turn.

**Row 2 (opening loops):** Hold knitting needle close to work. Extend loop on hook slightly and place on knitting needle. \*Working in front loops only, insert hook in next sc, yarn over and draw up a loop, extending the loop slightly place loop on the knitting needle; repeat from \* across, turn—268 loops on needle.

**Row 3 (closing loops):** Working loosely, insert hook in first loop on knitting needle, yarn over and draw up a loop; ch 1, sc in same loop; remove loop from knitting needle, \*sc in next loop on knitting needle, remove loop from knitting needle; repeat from \* until all loops are removed from knitting needle, turn—268 sts.

Fasten off. Align sts of Row 3 with sts of shawl edging. Using yarn needle, whipstitch shawl base and motif strip together, sewing through corresponding sts.

### Border

Note: The shawl has two side corners and one point. The corners are located at each side and correspond to the outer corners of the first and last motifs of the motif strip. The point is located at the lowest point of the shawl and corresponds with the lowest point of the center motif of the motif strip.

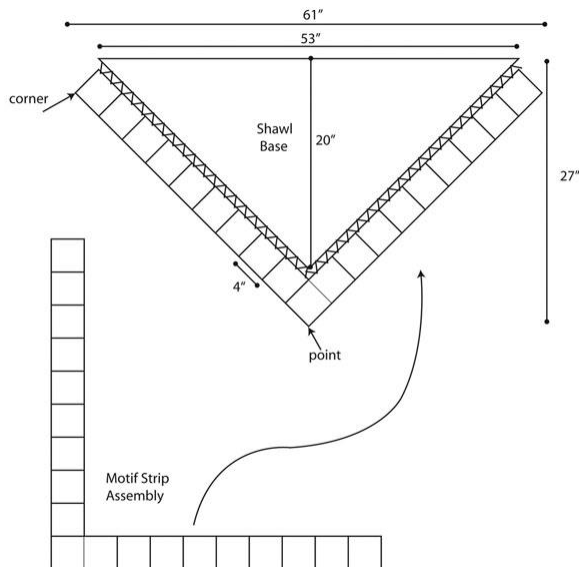


With RS facing, join yarn with slip st in any st along edge of shawl.

**Round 1:** Ch 1, work sc evenly spaced around entire shawl, working 3 sc in each corner and point of shawl; join with slip st in first st.

**Round 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in each corner and point of shawl; join with slip st in first st. Fasten off.

Using yarn needle, weave in ends.



## Cream Cotton Shrug

You can wear this Cream Cotton Shrug over a sweater in the fall or as a light jacket in the summer. Crochet this shrug in your free time and you won't regret it!



**Crochet Hook:** J/10 or 6 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- 12 oz. Sugar n Cream cotton yarn (or any other yarn that will give you the same gauge)
- Size J crochet hook

### Gauge:

5 dc, ch 1 pattern = 3 inches, 6 rows

of dc, ch 1 pattern =5 inches.

### Size:

20 inches across the back under the arms and 16 inches across the back between the shoulders.

Sleeves measure 13 inches from under the arm to the end and 15 inches from the shoulder to the end. 20 inches in length.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### SQUARES: Make 8

**Rnd 1:** ch 5, join, ch 3, work 15 dc around ring, join.

**Rnd 2:** ch 1, sc in same st, \* ch 1 , sc in next st \* rep around, ch 1 join in beg sc.

**Rnd 3:** ch 5, dc in same st, ch 2, dc in same st, ch 2, sk next sc, dc in next sc, ch 2 \* sk next sc, (dc, ch 2, dc, ch 2, dc) in next sc, ch 2 sk next sc, dc in next sc, ch 2\* rep around, join.

**Rnd 4:** ch 1, sc in same st, \* 2 sc in ch sp, 3 sc in corner dc, 2 sc in ch sp, sc in dc, 2 sc in ch sp, sc in dc \* rep around, fasten off. Join squares by stitching through both loops.

### BODY:

**Row 1:** attach yarn on right side of

sew squares in top right corner, ch 1, work 119 sc across, turn.

**Row 2:** ch 4, \* Sk 1 sc, dc in next sc, ch 1 \* rep across, turn.

**Row 3:** ch 3, dc in ch 1 sp, \* ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp \* rep to last ch 1 sp, dc in ch 1 sp, dc in 3rd ch of ch 4, turn.

**Row 4:** ch 4, sk 1 dc, dc in next ch 1 sp, \* ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp \* rep to last ch 1 sp, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in top of ch 3, turn.

**Row 5:** rep row 3.

**Row 6:** rep row 4.

**Row 7:** rep row 3.

**Row 8:** rep row 4.

**RIGHT FRONT:**

**Row 9:** ch 3, dc in ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 13 times, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 10:** rep row 4.

**Row 11:** ch 3, dc in ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 12 times, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 12:** rep row 4.

**Row 13:** rep row 3.

**Row 14:** rep row 4.

**Row 15:** ch 3, sk ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 10 times, ch 1, dc in last sp, dc in 3rd ch of ch 4, turn.

**Row 16:** ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 9 times, ch 1, sk dc and ch 1 sp, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 17:** rep row 3.

**Row 18:** ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 8 times, ch 1, sk dc and ch 1 sp, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 19:** rep row 3.

**Row 20:** ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 7 times, ch 1, sk dc and ch 1 sp, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 21:** ch 3, sk ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 7 times, dc in 3rd ch of ch 4, turn.

**Row 22:** ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 5 times, ch 1, sk dc and ch 1 sp, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 23:** ch 1, sc in same sp, sc in each dc and ch 1 sp across, fasten off.

**BACK:**

**Row 9:** To attach yarn work on right side to the left of the right front, sk 1 dc, attach yarn in next dc, ch 3, dc in ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 26 times, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 10:** rep row 4.

**Row 11:** ch 3, sk ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 24 times, sk dc, dc in top of ch 3, turn.

**Row 12, 14, 16, 18, 20:** rep row 4.

**Row 13, 15, 17, 19:** rep row 3.

**Row 21:** ch 1, sc in same sp, sc in each dc and ch 1 sp across, fasten off.

**LEFT FRONT SIDE:**

**Row 9:** To attach yarn work on right side to the left of the back, sk 1 dc, attach yarn in next dc, ch 3, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 13 times, dc in 3rd ch of ch 4, turn.

**Row 10:** rep row 4.

**Row 11:** ch 3, sk ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 12 times, dc in 3rd ch of ch 4, turn.

**Row 12:** ch 4, sk 1 dc, dc in ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 11 times, ch 1, dc in top of ch 3, turn.

**Row 13:** rep row 3.

**Row 14:** rep row 4.

**Row 15:** ch 3, dc in ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next dc) 11 times, dc in next dc, turn.

**Row 16:** ch 4, sk dc ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 9 times, ch 1, dc in top of ch 3, turn.

**Row 17:** rep row 3.

**Row 18:** ch 4, sk dc ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 8 times, ch 1, dc in top of ch 3, turn.

**Row 19:** rep row 3.

**Row 20:** ch 4, sk dc ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 7 times, ch 1, sk 1 dc, dc in top of ch 3, turn.

**Row 21:** ch 3, dc in ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 7 times, dc in 3rd ch of ch 4, turn.

**Row 22:** ch 4, sk dc ch 1 sp and dc, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 5 times, ch 1, sk 1 dc, dc in top of ch 3, turn.

**Row 23:** ch 1, sc in same sp, sc in each ch 1 sp and dc across, fasten off.

Sew shoulder seams together.

**LEFT SLEEVE (Worked in rows and rnds):**

**Row 1:** Working on right side of left front, attach yarn over end st of row 12 of sleeve opening, ch 4, dc over end st of row 13, (ch 1, dc over next row) 9 times, ch 1, dc at center where shouldersre are stitched, (ch 1, dc over next row) 9 times, turn.

**Rnd 2:** sl st into ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 17 times, ch 1, dc in ch 4 sp, ch 1, dc in same ch 4 sp, ch 1, dc over row 11, ( ch 1, dc over next row) 2 times, (ch 1 dc in next ch 1 sp) 2 times, (ch 1, dc over next row ) 3 times, ch 1, dc in ch 4 sp of row 1, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch 4, DO NOT TURN.

**Row 3:** sl st into next ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 17 times, turn.

**Rnd 4:** sl st into ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 15 times, ( ch 1, dc in ch 4 sp) 2 times, ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp of row 3, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 10 times, ch 1, dc over last dc of row 3, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch 4. DO NOT TURN.

**Rnd 5:** sl st into next ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, \* ch 1 dc in next ch 1 sp \* rep around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch 4. DO NOT TURN.

**Rnd 6:** rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 7:** sl st into ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 8 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 9 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 9 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch 4.

**Rnd 8:** rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 9:** rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 10:** sl st into ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 7 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 8 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 8 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch 4.

**Rnd 11:** rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 12:** rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 13:** sl st into ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 6 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 7 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 7 times,

dc in next ch 1 sp, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch 4.

**Rnd 14:** rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 15:** sl st into ch 1 sp, ch 4, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 5 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, (ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 6 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, ( ch 1, dc in next ch 1 sp) 6 times, dc in next ch 1 sp, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch 4.

**Rnd 16:** rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 17:** ch 3, dc in each ch 1 sp and dc around, join.

**Rnd 18:** ch 1, sc in same st, sc around, join, fasten off.

#### **RIGHT SLEEVE:**

**Row 1:** Attach yarn on right side back in row 12 of the sleeve opening, , ch 4, dc over end st of row 13, (ch 1, dc over next row) 7 times, ch 1, dc at center where shoulders are stitched, (ch 1, dc over next row) 11 times, turn.

**Row 2- 18:** rep rows 2-18 of left sleeve. Fasten off.

**EDGING:**

**Rnd 1:** attach yarn in bottom corner of right front on right side (corner of square), ch 1, 3 sc in corner sp, sc in each sc across square and in row 1 of body, work 2 sc in each of next 12 row ends, 3 sc in next row end, 2 sc in next 8 row ends, 1 sc twice over shoulder, sc across back, sc twice over shoulder, 2 sc in next 8 row ends, 3 sc in next row end, 2 sc in next 12 row ends, sc in row 1 of body and each sc down square, 3 sc in corner sp of square, sc across bottom edge, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 2:** ch 1, sc in same sp, \* ch 3, sl st in 1st ch of ch 3, (picot made), sc in next 3 sc, \* rep around to bottom of left front, work 1 sc after last picot, sl st in next sc, fasten off.

## A Flower Triangle Shawl

This easy crochet pattern is a light shawl you can wear on a crisp autumn evening. In this pattern you will find three different crochet flower patterns to choose from and make it your own.



**Crochet Hook:** H/8 or 5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Caron International's Simply Soft (100% acrylic; 6 oz/170 g, 315 yds/288 m skein): 24 oz (4 skeins) Shown in: #9913 Lt. Country Blue

- One size US H-8 (5mm), or size to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

### Finished Measurements:

Approximately 76"/193cm across upper edge x 38"/96.5cm long, excluding fringe

### Gauge:

In Mesh st, 8 mesh sts (dc, ch) and 8 rows = 4"/10cm. Gauge is not critical for this project.

### STITCHES USED:

**Chain (ch):** Begin by making a slip knot on your hook. \* Wrap the yarn around the hook (yarn over) and pull up a loop, [draw the yarn through the loop on the hook to form the first chain]. Repeat from \* for number of chains required. Note: The loop on the hook is not included when counting the number of chains.

**Double Crochet (dc):** Yarn over hook, insert hook into stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, [yarn over and draw through two loops on hook] twice.

**Half Double Crochet (hdc):** Yarn over hook, insert hook into stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over and draw through all three loops on hook.



**Reverse single crochet (Rev sc):** Work as single crochet except, work across the row from left to right instead of right to left.

**Single Crochet (sc):** Insert hook in stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.

**Slip Stitch (slip st):** Insert hook in the stitch indicated, yarn over and draw through both the stitch and the loop on the hook.

**Treble Crochet (tr):** Yarn over hook two times, insert hook in stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, [yarn over and draw through two loops] three times.

#### **SHAWL:**

Beginning at upper edge, chain 246.

**Row 1:** Dc in sixth ch from hook (counts as first mesh st), \* ch 1, skip 1 ch, dc in the next ch; repeat from \* across, turn—121 mesh sts.

**Row 2:** Decrease 1 mesh st at each side as follows: Slip st in first ch-1 space and in the next dc, ch 4 (counts as first mesh st), \* dc in next dc, ch 1; repeat from \* across to last mesh st, turn, leaving remaining sts unworked,

turn—2 mesh sts decreased; 119 mesh sts remain after Row 2.

Repeat Row 2 until one mesh st remains.

Fasten off.

**Edging:** With RS facing, join yarn at upper right-hand corner.

**Round 1:** Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc evenly around entire edge of shawl, working 3 sc in remaining next 2 corners, end work 2 sc in same st as first sc, join with a slip st to first st; do NOT fasten off.

**Row 2:** With RS facing, working from left to right, work 1 row Rev sc across upper edge of Shawl.

Fasten off.

**FLOWERS:** Make 3 of each type

**Flower 1** Chain 5; join with a slip st to form ring.

**Round 1 (RS):** Ch 1, work 12 sc in ring, join with a slip st to first sc—12 sc.

**Round 2:** Ch 3 (counts as a dc), dc in same sc, work 2 dc in each sc around, join with a slip st to third ch of beg ch-3—24 dc.

**Round 3:** Slip st between the 2 dc; ch 1, sc in same space; ch 3, skip next 3 dc; \* sc in space between last dc skipped and the next dc, ch 3, skip next 3 dc; repeat from \* around, join with a slip st to first sc—8 sc/ch-3 spaces.

**Round 4:** Ch 1, sc in same sc, in next ch-3 space work [hdc, dc, 3 tr, dc, hdc] for petal, \* sc in next sc, work petal in next ch-3 space; repeat from \* around, join with a slip st to first sc—8 petals.

Fasten off.

**Flower 2** Chain 4; join with a slip st to form ring.

**Round 1 (RS):** Ch 1, work 12 sc in ring, join with a slip st to first sc—12 sc.

**Round 2:** Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), \* skip 1 sc, dc in next sc, 3 ch; repeat from \* around, join with slip st to first dc—6 dc/ch-3 spaces.

**Round 3:** Work [sc, 2 dc, tr, 2 dc, sc) in each ch-3 space around, join with a slip st to first sc—6 petals.

Fasten off.

**Flower 3**

Chain 4; join with a slip st to form ring.

**Round 1:** Ch 7 (counts as sc, ch 6), sc in ring, work [ch 6, sc in ring] 5 times, join with a slip st to first ch of beginning ch—6 ch-6 spaces.

Work remaining rounds without joining at the end of each round.

**Round 2:** Slip st in each of the next 3 ch, work [ch 4, sc in next ch-6 space] 6 times—6 ch-4 spaces.

**Round 3:** Work [ch 4, 2 sc in next ch-4 space, sc in next sc) 6 times.

**Round 4:** Work [ch 4, 2 sc in next ch-4 space, sc in each of the next 2 sc, skip 1 sc] 6 times.

**Round 5:** Work [ch 4, 2 sc in next ch-4 space, sc in each of the next 3 sc, skip 1 sc] 6 times.

Fasten off.

**Flower 4** Chain 4; join with a slip st to form ring.

**Round 1:** Ch 1, [sc in ring, ch 6] 8 times, join with a slip st to first sc—8 ch-6 spaces.

**Round 2:** In ch-6 space work [ch 4, 3 tr, ch 4, slip st), \* slip st in next ch-6

space, work [ch 4, 3 tr, ch 4, slip st) in same space; repeat from \* around—8 petals.

Fasten off.

**FINISHING:**

Cut strands 12" long.

Holding 3 strands together, fold fringe in half.

Using crochet hook, \* insert hook from WS to RS into first st at upper corner, pull through loop, insert ends into loop and pull tight against edge; repeat from \*, working a fringe approx every 1/2" along the 2 sides of Shawl; leave upper edge without fringe.

## Crochet Hooded Sweatshirt

A V-neck sweatshirt can also be made into a nice hoodie. Crochet yourself a casual and chunky sweatshirt. This free crochet pattern from Bernat Yarns is great for yourself or a friend. It's a great thing to wear to fall football games, apple picking, and other outdoor autumn activities.



**Crochet Hook:** J/10 or 6 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (5) Bulky/Chunky (12-15 stitches for 4 inches)

**Materials:**

- Bernat® Chunky (Ombres: 300 g / 10.5 oz) 3 (3-3-4-4-4) balls

### Sizes:

To fit bust measurement:

XS/S (M-L-XL-2/3XL-4/5XL): 28/34 (36/38-40/42-44/46-48/54-56/62) ins [71/86.5 (91.5/96.5-101.5/106.5-112/117-122/137-142/157.5) cm].

Finished bust: 38 (42-46-50-60-68) ins [96.5 (106.5-117-127-152.5-173) cm].

### Gauge:

14 sts and 16 rows = 4 ins [10 cm] in pat.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### BACK:

\*\*Ch 68 (74-82-88-106-120).

**1st row:** (RS). 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. \*Ch 1. Miss next ch. 1 sc in next ch. Rep from \* to end of ch. Turn. 67 (73-81-87- 105-119) sts.

**2nd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. \*Ch 1. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp.

Rep from \* to last sc. 1 sc in last sc. Turn.

**3rd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. \*Ch 1. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from \* to last sc. 1 sc in last sc. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows of pat for 5 ins [12.5 cm], ending with 3rd row. Place marker at each end of last row. Cont in pat for total length of 15 ins [38 cm], ending with 2nd row. Fasten off.

**Shape armholes:** Next row: (RS). Miss first 8 (8-10-12-20-26) sts. Join yarn with sl st in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. Pat to last 8 (8-10-12-20-26) sts. Turn. Leave rem sts unworked. 51 (57- 61-63-65-67) sts.\*\*

Cont even in pat until armholes measure 9 (9½-10-10½-11-12) ins [23 (24-25.5- 26.5-28-30.5) cm], ending with a 2nd row. Fasten off.

**FRONT:**

Work from \*\* to \*\* as given for Back. Cont even in pat until armholes measure 3 ins [7.5 cm], ending with a 2nd row.

**Divide for front opening:** Next row: Pat across 25 (28-30-31-32-33) sts. Turn. Leave rem sts unworked. Cont even until armhole measures 12 rows less than Back to shoulder, ending with a 2nd row.

**Shape neck:** Next row: (RS). Pat across 20 (22-23-23-24-24) sts. Draw up a loop in each of next 2 sts. Yoh and draw through all 3 loops on hook

– sc2tog made. Turn. 21 (23-24-24-25-25) sts.

**Next row:** Ch 1. Sc2tog over first 2 sts. Pat to end of row. Turn.

**Next row:** Ch 1. Pat to last 2 sts. Sc2tog over last 2 sts. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows once more. 17 (19-20-20-21-21) sts.

**Next row:** Ch 1. Pat to end of row. Turn.

**Next row:** Ch 1. Pat to last 2 sts. Sc2tog over last 2 sts. Turn. Rep last 2 rows twice more. 14 (16-17- 17-18-18) sts.

Work 1 row even. Fasten off.

With RS of work facing, miss center st. Join yarn with sl st to next st and pat to end of row.

Work as given for left side, reversing neck shaping.

**SLEEVES:**

Ch 36 (36-38-38-40-42).

Proceed in pat as given for Back for 4 rows. 35 (35-37-37-39-41) sts.

**Next row:** (RS). (Increase row). Ch 1. 2 sc in first st. Pat to last st. 2 sc in

last st. Turn.

Work 3 (3-2-2-2-2) rows even.

Rep last 4 (4-3-3-3-3) rows 12 (14-15-16-17-19) times more, then Increase row once. 63 (67-71-73-77-83) sts.

Cont even until work from beg measures 17½ (18-18-17½-17-16½) ins [44.5 (45.5-45.5-44.5-43-42) cm], ending with 2nd row. Place marker at each end of last row.

Work 9 (9-11-14-23-30) rows even. Fasten off.

#### **HOOD:**

Ch 98.

Proceed in pat as given for Back for 4 (5- 6-7-7-8) rows. 97 sts.

**Next 5 rows:** Ch 1. Sc2tog over first 2 sts. Pat to last 2 sts. Sc2tog over last 2 sts. Turn.

**Next row:** Ch 1. Pat to end of row. Turn.

**Next 3 rows:** Ch 1. Sc2tog over first 2 sts. Pat to last 2 sts. Sc2tog over last 2 sts. Turn. 81 sts at end of last row. Work 13 (14-15-17-17-18) rows even. Place marker at each end of last row.

**Shape back:** Next 8 rows: Sl st in each of first 3 sts. Pat to last 3 sts. Turn.

Leave rem sts unworked. 33 sts at end of last row. Fasten off.

Fold Hood in half, matching markers. Sew back seam from fold to markers.

#### **FINISHING:**

Sew shoulder seams.

Sew in Sleeves, placing rows above markers against missed sts of Front and Back to form square armholes. Sew side and sleeve seams, leaving sides open below markers for side slits. Pin Hood to neck edge, aligning back seam with center back neck and foundation ch with edges of front opening. Sew Hood in position.

## Crocheted Lace Stole

This autumnal lace scarf is perfect for end-of-the-year parties. You never know what you might find with our free easy crochet patterns!



**Crochet Hook:** H/8 or 5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (1) Super Fine (27-32 stitches to 4 inches)

### MATERIALS:

- Bounce™ – 3 balls 424 Mosaic (70% superwash wool/23% nylon/7% PBT; 3½ ounces/100 grams; 437 yards/400 meters)
- Crochet hook: US-H/8 (5mm)

### Finished Measurements:

15" x 60" (excluding fringe)

### Gauge:

20 dc and 10 rows = 4" Use any size hook necessary to obtain the specified gauge.

### Abbreviations:

ch – chain

dc – double crochet

mm – millimeter

rep – repeat

sc – single crochet

sk – skip

sp(s) – space(s)

\* – repeat instructions after asterisk as specified

### INSTRUCTIONS:

Ch 82.

**Row 1 (WS):** Sc in second ch from hook, \* ch 3, sk next 3 ch, sc in next ch; rep from \* across; turn – 21 sc and 20 ch-3 sps.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, 3 dc in first sc, \* sk in next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next sc; rep from \* across to last ch-3 sp, sk last ch-3 sp, sc in last sc; turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 6, sk first sc and next 3 dc, sc in next ch-3 sp, \* ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp; rep from \* across; turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 3 (counts as a dc), sk first sc, \* 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, dc in next sc; rep from \* across, ending with 3 dc in ch-6 sp, dc in third ch of turning ch-6; turn – 81 dc.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, \* ch 3, sk next 3 dc, sc in next dc; rep from \* across; turn – 21 sc and 20 ch-3 sps.

Rep Rows 2-5 until Stole measures approximately 60" from beg, ending with Row 5; fasten off. Weave in ends.

**Fringe:**

Cut 18" lengths of yarn for fringe. Hold four lengths of yarn as a group; fold group in half. With RS facing, insert fold of yarn from front to back through first ch-3 sp along one short edge of Stole; bring ends of group through fold and pull to knot. Rep in each ch-3 sp across both short edges of Stole. Trim fringe evenly.

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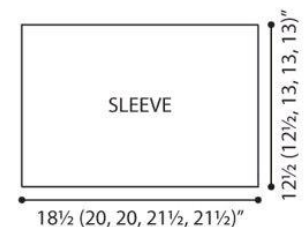
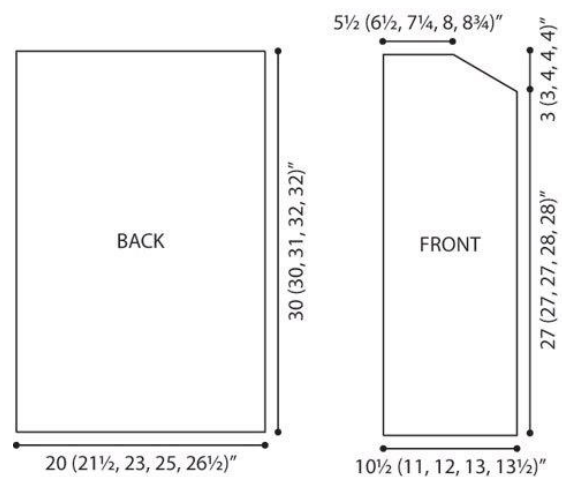

- Yarn needle
- Pattern



**Crochet Hook:** I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### MATERIALS:

- One size US I-9 (5.5 mm) crochet hook, or size to obtain gauge.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

### SIZES

S (M, L, 1X, 2X)

**FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:**

Bust 41 (43 1/2, 47, 51, 53 1/2)/104  
(110.5, 119.5, 129.5, 136) cm

Length 30 (30, 31, 32, 32)"/76 (76,  
78.5, 81.5, 81.5) cm

**Note:** Jacket will lengthen when worn.

**GAUGE**

In Jacket pattern, using smaller hook,  
5 pattern repeats and 10 rows =  
4"/10cm.

in indicated st 2 rows below, yarn  
over and draw up a loop to height of  
current row, yarn over and draw  
through both loops on hook. Skip the  
corresponding st in the current row.

**PATTERN STITCHES:**

**Border Pattern** (multiple of 2 sts + 1)

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in 2nd ch from hook  
and in each remaining ch across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, \*Lsc in next  
sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* across,  
turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, Lsc in first sc, \*sc in next  
sc, Lsc in next sc; repeat from \*  
across.

Repeat last 2 rows for Border pattern.

**Jacket Pattern** (multiple of 3 sts + 1)

**Row 1:** Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in first st,  
\*sk next 2 sts, (2 dc, ch 2, sc) in next  
st; repeat from \* across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, sc) in first ch-2  
sp, (2 dc, ch 2, sc) in each ch-2 sp  
across, turn.

Repeat last row for Jacket pattern.

**BACK**

Border

With larger hook and B, ch 74 (80, 86,  
92, 98).

**Row 1:** Work Row 1 of Border  
pattern—73 (79, 85, 91, 97) sc.

**Rows 2–15:** Repeat Rows 2 and 3 of  
Border pattern 7 times.

**Row 16:** Work Row 2 of Border  
pattern. Change to A.

Body

Change to smaller hook.

**Row 1:** Work Row 1 of Jacket  
pattern—25 (27, 29, 31, 33) pattern  
repeats.

Continue in Jacket pattern until piece measures 30 (30, 31, 32, 32)"/76 (76, 78.5, 81.5, 81.5) cm from beginning. Fasten off.

**FRONT** (make 2)

Border

With larger hook and B, ch 38 (40, 44, 46, 50).

Row 1: Work Row 1 of Border pattern—37 (39, 43, 45, 49) sc.

Rows 2–15: Repeat Rows 2 and 3 of Border pattern 7 times.

Row 16: Ch 1, work 1 (2, 1, 2, 1) sc in first sc, \*Lsc in next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* across, turn—37 (40, 43, 46, 49) sts. Change to A.

Body

Change to smaller hook.

Row 1: Work Row 1 of Jacket pattern—13 (14, 15, 16, 17) pattern repeats.

Continue in Jacket pattern until piece measures 27 (27, 27, 28, 28)"/68.5 (68.5, 68.5, 71, 71) cm from beginning. Do not fasten off.

Shape Neck

Row 1: Ch 3, sk first ch-2 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, (dc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, \*(2 dc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across, turn—11 (12, 13, 14, 15) pattern repeats.

Row 2: Work Row 2 of Jacket pattern across.

Rows 3–6: Repeat last 2 rows 2 more times—7 (8, 9, 10, 11) pattern repeats.

Repeat Row 2 until piece measures same as back.

Fasten off.

**SLEEVE** (make 2)

Border

With larger hook and B, ch 68 (74, 74, 80, 80).

Row 1: Work Row 1 of Border pattern—67 (73, 73, 79, 79) sc.

Rows 2–15: Repeat Rows 2 and 3 of Border pattern 7 times.

Row 16: Work Row 2 of Border pattern. Change to A.

Body

Change to smaller hook.

Row 1: Work Row 1 of Jacket pattern—23 (25, 25, 27, 27) pattern repeats.

Continue in Jacket pattern until piece measures 12 1/2 (12 1/2, 13, 13, 13)"/32 (32, 33, 33, 33) cm from beginning. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

With A, sew shoulder seams. Sew top of sleeves to body, centering top edge of sleeve at shoulder seam. Sew side and sleeve seams.

### Right Front Edging

Row 1: With RS facing, join B in lower front corner, work sc evenly up front edge to neck shaping, changing to A at beginning of body, ensure that you have an odd number of sts, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, ch 4, sk next 4 sc (buttonhole made), ch 1, sc in next sc, \*Lsc in next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* across, changing to B at beginning of border, turn.

Row 3: Work Row 2 of Border pattern to the ch-4 buttonhole, 4 sc in ch-4 sp, sc in last 2 sc. Fasten off.

### Left Front Edging

Row 1: With RS facing, join A in beginning of neck shaping, work sc evenly down front edge to lower corner, changing to B at beginning of border, ensure that you have an odd number of sts, turn.

Rows 2 and 3: Work Row 2 of Border pattern.

Fasten off.

### Collar

Row 1: With WS facing and smaller hook, join B in beginning of neck shaping, work sc evenly around neck edge to beginning of opposite neck shaping, ensure that you have an odd number of sts, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in each sc across, turn.

Change to larger hook, repeat Row 2 of Border pattern until collar measures 3"/7.5 cm from beginning.

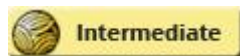
Fasten off.

Using yarn needle, weave in all ends. Sew button to left front, opposite buttonhole.

## Caton Cowl

Get ready for fall with this adorable Caton Cowl scarf. This is just one of many free crochet patterns that you can follow to help get your closet ready for the cooler temperatures. Pick two of your favorite colors and get started today



**Crochet Hook:** P/16 or 16 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (6) Super Bulky/Super Chunky (4-11 stitches for 4 inches)

**Materials:**

- Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick in Claret (Main Color, 2 skeins) and Fisherman (Contrasting Color, 2 skeins), or any #6 super bulky weight yarn

### Measurements:

One Size: 7 1/4" wide, 69" long

### Gauge:

5 rows, 2 bobbles and 2 dc per row = 4" square, though exact gauge isn't necessary for this project.

### Notes:

This cowl is worked in the round with an infinity loop.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

With MC, ch 100, join w/ ss to beg. ch to form loop. Ch 1, turn.

**Row 1:** Sc in each ch around. Join w/ ss to beg. sc. Turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 2, \*With CC, in next sc (yo and draw up a loop, yo, pull through 2 loops) 5 times (bobble made), then switch to MC, yo and draw through all 5 loops on hook, dc in next 2 sc, repeat from \* around, ss in ch 2. Turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st around. Join w/ ss to first sc of rnd. Turn.

**Rows 4-7:** Repeat Rows 2 and 3.

**Row 8:** Ch 2, \*W/ CC in same sc as Ch 2 (yo and draw up a loop, yo and

pull through 2 loops) 5 times (bobble made), w/ MC, yo and draw through all loops on hook, dc in next 2 sc, repeat from \* around.

**Row 9:** Repeat Row 3.

**Row 10:** Repeat Row 2.

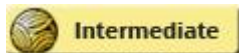
**Row 11:** Repeat Row 3.

Fasten off, weave in loose ends.

## Diamond Crochet Cowl

Dress up your neck with this gorgeous Diamond Crochet Cowl. With only 18 rows, this crochet pattern works up quickly using worsted weight yarn. Make one for yourself, or give one to a friend!



**Crochet Hook:** I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn, 210 yards

### Abbreviations:

Fsc - foundation single crochet  
Fptrc2tog – front post treble crochet two together

### Note:

This cowl pattern starts with a fsc,

but you can start with a row of ch and a row of sc if preferred. The stitch pattern works with multiples of 4, so it's easily customizable if the given sizes aren't what you are looking for – go all the way up around 140 for a really long drapery cowl!

### INSTRUCTIONS:

Row 1: Fsc 76 (84). Join with sl st to work in the round. (You can use the tail to snug up the bottom of the fsc before weaving in ends, so leave a few inches to work with.)

Row 2: Ch3, dc in next st and ea st to end of round. Join with sl st. (Ch3 counts as dc)

Row 3: Ch1, sc in first 3 sts. Fptrc2tog over next st: working first fptrc around the 2nd fsc in row 1 until 2 loops left on hook, skip 3 sc on row 1 and work second fptrc around 6th sc until 3 loops left on hook. Yarn over and pull through all loops. \*Sc in next 3 sts. Fptrc2tog, working first fptrc around the base of the last fptrc, sk 3 sc and work second fptrc around next sc.\* Repeat from \* to \* end, join with sl st to the first st of the row.

Row 4: Ch3, dc in next st and ea st to end of round. Join with sl st.

Row 5: Ch1, sc in 1st st. Fptrc2tog, going around the tops of the

fptrc2tog of row 3 (where you “joined” the last 3 loops on the hook), creating diamond shapes. Do this by sliding the hook from right to left all the way under both of the post stitches, staying on top of the background fabric. \*Sc in next 3 sts, then Fptrc2tog\* to last 2 sts. Sc in last 2 sts, then join with sl st.

Row 6: Ch3, dc in next st and ea st to end of round. Join with sl st.

Row 7: Repeat Row 3, except go around the fptrc2tog tops.

Row 8-15: Repeat rows 4-7 twice.

Row 16-17: Repeat rows 4-5.

Row 18: Sc around, then use seamless join to finish off. Weave in ends.

## Crocheted Neck Cozy

A free crochet pattern like this crocheted neck cozy is great to make before the seasons start to change. Wear your new cozy in the autumn when taking a stroll through the park. Use two contrasting colors for the best outcome. This is also a very quick pattern to complete; it can be done in one evening. It's also a great stash buster project!



**Crochet Hook:** G/6 or 4 mm hook,  
J/10 or 6 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium  
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran  
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Crochet hooks, J and G
- 3.5 oz worsted weight yarn, a main color and a small amount of contrasting color (if not using a contrasting yarn then 4 oz of the main color).

### INSTRUCTIONS:

With J hook chain 25, sc in first chain from hook and across, 24 sc, ch1, turn.

sc in same stitch as ch1, \*dc in next stitch, sc in next stitch,\* repeat across ending with a dc, ch1, turn.

Repeat row 2 till you have reached 27 inches.

sc in same stitch as ch1, continue with the dc, sc, repeat for 8 stitches, chain 8, skip 8 stitches, continue dc, sc repeat to end of row (last 8 stitches)ending with dc, ch1, turn

Repeat row 2 until you have total length of 32 inches.

Finish off main color, attach contrasting yarn, ch1, sc, ch3, skip one stitch and sc in next,\*ch3, skip one stitch, sc in next st\*, repeat around, slip stitch to beginning sc and fasten off.

Using G Hook, fasten main color to side stitch on opening pass through, ch1, sc, sc around for 26 singles crochets, join with slip stitch and fasten off.

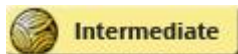
**Note:**

Putting this row of single crochets will keep the opening from stretching out.

## Bright Falling Leaves Afghan

Nothing says autumn quite like falling leaves. The beautiful leaf pattern of this crocheted afghan makes it perfect for the fall season. It's sure to brighten up any room and would look great sprawled across the bed. This is an intermediate afghan pattern.



**Crochet Hook:** J/10 or 6 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Yarn: RED HEART® "Fiesta™": 6 skeins 6350 Horizon MC., RED HEART® "Soft Yarn": 3 skeins 1882 Toast A; 1 skein each

4422 Tangerine B, 9522 Leaf C, 4412 Grass Green D, and 9275 Paprika E.

- Crochet Hook: 6mm [US J-10]
- Yarn needle

### Measurements:

48" X 70"

### Gauge:

16 sts = 4"; 6 rows = 4"

### INSTRUCTIONS:

**To change color:** Work last st with color in use until there are 2 loops left on hook, drop color in use, draw next color through 2 loops and continue with new color.

With A, ch 251.

### Border-

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in next ch, \* ch 1, skip next ch, dc in next ch; repeat from \* to last ch; dc in last ch; turn – 123 ch-1 sps.

Row 2 (Right Side): Ch 3, skip first dc, dc in next dc, \* skip next ch-1 sp, skip next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, 3 dc over the last dc made, skip next dc,

skip next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc;  
repeat from \* to last st; dc in top of  
ch-3; turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, skip first dc, dc in next  
dc, \* ch 2, sc in top of next ch-3, ch 2,  
dc in next dc; repeat from \* to last st;  
dc in top of ch-3; turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, skip first dc, dc in next  
dc, \* ch 1, [dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 1]  
twice, dc in next dc; repeat from \* to  
last st; dc in top of ch-3 changing to  
MC.

Fasten off A.

**\*\* Panel-Row 1 (Wrong Side):**  
With MC, ch 1, sc in first 2 dc, \* ch 1,  
skip ch-1 sp, sc in dc; repeat from \* to  
last st; sc in top of ch-3; turn.

Row 2 (Right Side): Ch 3, 2 dc in first  
sc, \* skip next 3 sts (the sc, ch-1 sp,  
and sc), work (sc, ch 3, 2 dc) all in  
next ch-1 sp; repeat from \* to last 2  
sc; skip next sc, sc in last sc; turn.

Rows 3-16: Ch 3, 2 dc in first sc, \* (sc,  
ch 3, 2 dc) all over next ch-3; repeat  
from \* to last st; sc in top of ch-3;  
turn.

Row 17: Ch 3, \* (sc, ch 1, hdc, dc) all  
over next ch- 3; repeat from \* to last

3 sts; skip next dc, sc in next dc and  
top of ch-3; turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, \* ch 1,  
skip next dc, sc in hdc, ch 1, skip ch-1  
sp, sc in next sc; repeat from \* to last  
st; sc in top of ch-3 changing to A.

Fasten off MC.

### **Border-**

Row 1: With A, ch 3, skip first sc, dc in  
next sc, \* ch 1, dc in next sc; repeat  
from \* to last sc; dc in last sc; turn.

Rows 2-4: Repeat Rows 2-4 of Border.  
\*\*

Repeat from \*\* to \*\* 3 more times –  
4 panels and 5 border sections.  
Fasten off A.

### **Top and Bottom Borders-**

Row 1: With right side facing, attach  
A at corner; ch 1, work 2 sc in row  
end(s), [ch 1, skip a sp equal to one  
sc, sc in row end] 90 times evenly  
across to next corner, work one more  
sc at corner; turn. Note: Work evenly  
to keep work flat and to have a  
multiple of 3 ch-1 spaces across the  
edge.

Row 2: Ch 3, skip first sc, dc in next sc, \* ch 1, dc in next sc; repeat from \* to last sc; dc in last sc; turn.

Rows 3-5: Repeat Rows 2-4 of Border. Fasten off.

Repeat same at opposite edge.

### **Edging:**

Rnd 1: TOP EDGE: With right side facing, attach A at corner of top edge; ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) all in corner, ch 1, \* skip next st, sc in ch-1 sp, ch 1; repeat from \* to next corner; (sc, ch 1, sc) all in corner; SIDE EDGE: [ch 1, sc] 4 times across edge of top border, ch 1, sc between next 2 dc at start of side border, \*\* ch 1, skip next st, sc in ch-1 sp; repeat from \*\* to next corner; ch 1; repeat from \* around; join with a slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: With right side facing, attach MC in ch-2 sp at any corner; ch 1, \*\* (sc, ch 2, sc) all in ch-2 sp, ch 1, \* skip next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; repeat from \* to next corner; repeat from \*\* around; join. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

### **LEAVES:**

(Make 13 for each Panel): With B, C, D, and E make leaves as follows choosing colors for each panel:

Rnd 1: With color chosen, ch 11, work 4 tr in 5th ch from hook, dc in next 2 ch, hdc in next 2 ch, sc in next ch, work (sc, ch 2, sc) in last ch, working along opposite side of ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next 2 ch, dc in next 2 ch, 4 tr in same ch as beg tr; join with a slip st in top of ch-4.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in joining, 2 sc in each of next 4 tr, sc in next 6 sts, (sc, ch 2, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, sc) all in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in each of next 4 tr, sc in joining; ch 7 for stem, slip st in 2nd ch from hook and in next 5 ch, slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

Sew 13 leaves to each panel of random colors as shown.

## Colorful Autumn Granny Afghan

This easy granny square afghan is great for the fall season. Its dark fall colors will really set the tone in your home. Use whatever colors match your décor, but we think harvest colors are definitely the way to go with this crochet afghan pattern.



**Crochet Hook:** J/10 or 6 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Size 6 mm (U.S. J or 10) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

- Bernat® Super Value Harvest Colors (197 g/7 oz)
- One ball each of:
  - Main Color (MC): (#53015 Taupe Heather)
  - Contrast A: (#53521 Rustic Heather)
  - Contrast B: (#53014 Steel Blue Heather)
  - Contrast C: (#53241 Moss Heather)
  - Contrast D: (#53309 Plum Heather)
  - Contrast E: (#53203 Teal Heather)
  - Contrast F: (#53522 Redwood Heather)

### Measurements:

Approximately 46 x 52 ins [117 x 132 cm]

### Gauge:

12 sc and 13 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].  
Motif = 6 ins [15 cm] square.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

#### Motif I

\*\*Ch 4. Join in rnd with sl st to form a ring.

1st rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc in ring. Ch 2. (3 dc. Ch 2) 3 times in ring. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.\*\*

2nd rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. [Ch 1. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

3rd rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. [Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

4th rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. [(Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) twice. Ch 1. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. (Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) twice. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. Fasten off.

### **Motif II**

Work from \*\* to \*\* as given for Motif I.

2nd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. [(2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc] 3 times. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

3rd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). [1 dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 4 times. 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

4th rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). [1 dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 4 times. 1 dc in each of next 4 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

Fasten off.

### **AFGHAN:**

Work Motif I, as follows:

With MC, make 1.

With A, make 6.

With B, make 3.

With C, make 4.

With D, make 5.

With E, make 2.

With F, make 7.

Work Motif II, as follows:

With MC, make 7.

With A, make 2.

With B, make 5.

With C, make 4.

With D, make 3.

With E, make 6.

With F, make 1.

Sew 8 Motifs into 7 Strips (see Diagram).

MC-II	A-I	B-II	C-I	D-II	E-I	F-II
F-I	MC-II	A-I	B-II	C-I	D-II	E-I
E-II	F-I	MC-II	A-I	B-II	C-I	D-II

**Edging:** With RS of work facing, join MC with sl st to any corner ch-2 sp. Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as sl st. Work 1 rnd of sc evenly around entire Afghan, having 3 sc in corners. Join with sl st to first sc. Join A.

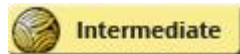
Rep last rnd in following sequence: A, B, C, D, E, and F. Fasten off.



## Burnt Orange Striped Throw

You'll love the color of this Burnt Orange Striped Throw; it's great for the fall season. Combine Super Tweed and Super Saver yarns to work in two colors with a foundation for this afghan crochet pattern.



**Crochet Hook:** J/10 or 6 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Red Heart® “Super Tweed™” (Art. E779) 5 oz (141g), 266 yd (243m) skeins: 5 skeins 7901 Fire **A**

- Red Heart® “Super Saver” (Art. E300) solid color 7 oz (198 g), 364 yd (333 m); multicolor, heather and print 5 oz (141 g), 244 yd (223 m), flecks 5 oz (141g), 260 yds (238 m) skeins: 1 skein each 321 Gold **B**, 256 Carrot **C**
- Crochet Hook: 6mm [US J-10]
- Yarn needle

### Gauge:

14 sts = 4” and 7 rows = 4”, in pattern.

**Check your gauge.** Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

### Special Stitches:

**shell** = (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated stitch or space.

**Fpdc** = Front post double crochet.

Yarn over, insert hook from the front side of the work to back and to front again around the post of the indicated stitch on a previous row; yarn over and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (2 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (1 loop on hook).

**Bpdc** = Back post double crochet.

Yarn over, insert hook from the back side of the work to front and to back

again around the post of the indicated stitch on a previous row; yarn over and pull up a loop (3 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (2 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through 2 loops (1 loop on hook)

**Note:** To change color, work last stitch of row until 2 loops remain on hook, drop old color, yarn over with new color and complete stitch. Fasten off old color.

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

Row 1 (Right Side): With A ch 113; sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across, turn—112 sc.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), 2 dc in first sc, skip next 2 sc, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next sc (shell made), skip next 2 sc, \*dc in next 2 sc, skip next 2 sc, shell in next sc, skip next 2 sc; repeat from \* across to last sc, 3 dc in last sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in first dc, shell in ch-2 space of next shell, \*skip next 2 dc, Fpdc around each of next 2 dc, shell in ch-2 space of next shell; repeat from \* across, 3 dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, 2 dc in first dc, shell in ch-2 space of next shell, \*skip next 2 dc, Bpdc around each of next 2 dc, shell in ch-2 space of next shell; repeat from \* across, 3 dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Rows 5-10: Work Rows 3 and 4 three more times; change to B in last st of Row 10. Fasten off A.

Row 11 (Right Side): With B, repeat Row 3; change to A in last st. Fasten off B.

Row 12: With A, repeat Row 4; change to C in last st. Fasten off A.

Rows 13 and 14: With C, repeat Rows 3 and 4; change to A in last st of Row 14. Fasten off C.

Row 15: With A, repeat Row 3; change to B in last st. Fasten off A.

Row 16: With B, repeat Row 4; change to A in last st. Fasten off B.

Rows 17-26: With A, repeat Rows 3 and 4 five times; change to B in last st of Row 26. Fasten off A.

Rows 27-32: Repeat Rows 11-16.

Rows 33-64: Work Rows 17-32 two more times.

Rows 65–73: Repeat Rows 17–25.

Row 74: Ch 1, sc in first dc, skip next 2 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, slip st in next ch-2 space, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, \*dc in next 2 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, slip st in next ch-2 space, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc; repeat from \* across to last 3 dc, skip next 2 dc, sc in last dc—112 sts. Fasten off.

**Border:**

Round 1 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of B in end of Row 73, to work across the side edge of throw, ch 1, work 2 sc in end of each dc row across side edge (skip the ends of the sc row at beginning and end of the side edge); working across opposite side of foundation ch, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first ch (corner made, sc in each ch across to last ch, (sc, ch 2, sc) in last ch for corner; work 2 sc in end of each dc row across other side edge; working across sts of last row, (sc, ch 2, sc) in first st for corner; sc in each st across to last st, (sc, ch 2, sc) in last st for corner; join with slip st in first sc—146 sc across each side of throw, 112 sc across top and bottom, and 4 ch-2 corner spaces.

Round 2 (Right Side): Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 space; join with slip st in first sc—148 sc across each side, 114 sc across top and bottom, and 4 ch-2 corner spaces. Fasten off B.

Round 3 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of A in any ch-2 space to work across a short edge of throw, ch 3 (counts as dc), (dc, ch 2, 2 dc, sc) in same ch-2 space, [\*skip next 2 sc, shell in next sc, skip next 2 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* across to next corner ch-2 space, shell in corner ch-2 space, skip next sc, sc in next sc, \*\*skip next 2 sc, shell in next sc, skip next 2 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \*\* across to 2 sc before next corner ch-2 space, skip next 2 sc\*\*\*, (shell, sc) in corner ch-2 space] twice ending last repeat at \*\*\*; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-3. Fasten off A.

Round 4 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of C in any ch-2 space near the center of either side edge, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 space, [shell in next sc, \*sc in next ch-2 space, shell in next sc; repeat from \* to next corner ch-2 space, ([sc, ch 2] 3 times, sc) in corner ch-2 space] 4

times, shell in next sc, \*\*sc in next ch-2 space, shell in next sc; repeat from \*\* to end of round; join with slip st in first sc, TURN.

Round 5 (Wrong Side): Slip st to next ch-2 space, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 space, [\*shell in next sc, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from \* to next corner, shell in first ch-2 space of corner, (sc, ch 3, sc) in corner ch-2 space, shell in last ch-2 space of corner, sc in next ch-2 space] 4 times, shell in next sc, \*\*sc in next ch-2 space, shell in next sc; repeat from \*\* to end of round; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off C.

Round 6 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of A in any ch-2 space near center of either side, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 space, [\*shell in next sc, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from \* to next corner ch-3 space, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in corner ch-3 space, sc in next ch-2 space] 4 times, shell in next sc, \*\*sc in next ch-2 space, shell in next sc; repeat from \*\* to end of round; join with slip st in first sc, TURN.

Round 7 (Wrong Side): Slip st to next ch-2 space, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 space, [shell in next sc, \*sc in next ch-

2 space, shell in next sc; repeat from \* to next corner, sc in center dc of first 3-dc group of corner, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, sc in center dc of next 3-dc group of corner] 4 times, shell in next sc, \*\*sc in next ch-2 space, shell in next sc; repeat from \*\* to end of round; join with slip st in first sc, TURN.

Rounds 8 and 9 (Right Side): Work same as Round 7; do not turn at end of rounds.

Round 10 (Right Side): [\*Ch 3, (slip st, ch 3, slip st) in next ch-2 space, ch 3, slip st in next sc; repeat from \* to next corner, ch 1, slip st in center dc of first 3-dc group of corner, ch 3, (slip st, ch 3, slip st) in corner ch-2 space, ch 3, slip st in center dc of next 3-dc group of corner, ch 1, slip st in next sc] 4 times, ch 3, (slip st, ch 3, slip st) in next ch-2 space, ch 3, \*\*slip st in next sc, ch 3, (slip st, ch 3, slip st) in next ch-2 space, ch 3; repeat from \* to end of round; join with slip st in base of beginning ch-3. Fasten off.

### **Finishing:**

Weave in ends. With Wrong Side facing, lightly block border rounds only.

## Autumn Nature Dishcloth

The cluster stitch is used in this Autumn Nature Dishcloth and what almost looks like the shell stitch for the corners. This is such a pretty dishcloth if a fun variegated yarn is used. Try your hand at this new pattern and throw out your old dishcloths.



**Crochet Hook:** G/6 or 4 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

**Materials:**

- Crochet hook, G

- Cotton yarn

### Abbreviations:

CL=Cluster

FPDC=Front Post Double Crochet

BPDC=Back Post Double Crochet

BPSC=Back Post Single Crochet

### Special Stitches & Notes:

**BEG CL CORNER:** Ch2 and keeping last loop of each dc on hook, 2 dc in st or sp indicated; YO and draw through all 3 loops on hook. Ch2, then work a Cluster in same st.

**CLUSTER St (CL):** Keeping last loop of each dc on hook, 3 dc in st or sp indicated; YO and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

### NOTES:

In round 7 when you do the 2nd BPDC around the sc, make sure you work in front of the 1st dc you did.

**CH1 SPACES:** These are the spaces between the cluster sts, they won't look much like a ch1 sp, but they are there

### INSTRUCTIONS:

Rnd 1: Ch4, work 11DC in 4th ch fr hook. Join. (12dc)

Rnd 2: Ch3, DC in same st. 2DC in each st around. Join with a sl st around post of beg ch3. (24dc)

Rnd 3: Ch3 \*BPDC around next dc, FPDC around next dc\* repeat around ending with a BPDC. Join in top of ch3. (24dc)

Rnd 4: Ch2 and keeping last loop of each dc on hook, 2 dc in same st as joining. YO and draw through all 3 loops on hook. [Ch1, skip a st (CL, Ch2, CL) in next st. Ch1, skip a st, CL in next st.]5Xs. Ch1, skip a st, (CL, Ch2, CL) in next st. Ch1, sl st in top of next cl. (18cl, 12ch1, 6ch2)

Rnd 5: Sl st in ch1 sp and Ch3 (3DC). [Ch1, sc in ch2 sp, (ch1, 4DC in ch1 sp)twice.]5Xs. Ch1, SC in ch2 sp, Ch1, 4DC in last ch1 sp. Ch1 and join with a sl st around post of 1st ch3. (48dc & 6sc)

Rnd 6: Ch1, BPSC around the same st as joining. Ch2, BPDC around 3sts. [+2 BPDC around post of next sc \*see notes.+ BPDC in 8sts+]5Xs. Repeat between ++ once then BPDC around last 4sts. Join in top of beg ch2. (60dc)

Rnd 7: Work a beg CL Corner \*See special sts. [+Ch1, CL in next st, Ch1,

HDC in 3sts, SC in 6sts, HDC in 3sts, Ch1, CL in next st, ch1,+ (CL, ch2, CL) in next st] 3Xs. Repeat ++ once and join in top of beg cl. (24hdc, 24sc, 16cl)

Rnd 8: Sl st into ch2 and Beg CL Corner. [+ (Ch1, CL in next cl, Ch1, CL in ch1 sp)twice, ch1, HDC in 12sts, (Ch1, CL in ch1 sp, Ch1, CL in next cl)twice. Ch1,+ (CL, Ch2, CL) in next ch2 sp.] 3Xs Then repeat ++ once and join in top of next cl. (48hdc & 40cl).

## Felted Fall Leaf Pillow

Crochet this beautiful fall leaf pillow for the autumn season. The colors and design make this a really neat free crochet pattern. It makes for fabulous decor in any room.



**Crochet Hook:** J/10 or 6 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Patons Merino Wool (or any 100% feltable wool)  
-1 skn Deep Olive (3.5 oz/ 100g/ 223yds)

-1 skn Rich Red (3.5 oz/100g/ 223yds)

-1 skn Old Gold (3.5oz/100g/ 223 yds)

- J hook ( I crochet loosely. If you crochet tight, go up one to two hook sizes)
- Stitch marker
- Stuffing
- Needle for final assembly

### Note:

Do not join rounds unless indicated.

### INSTRUCTIONS:

Starting at the bottom with Deep Olive:

ch2

1- 6sc in 2nd ch. (6)

2- 2sc in each sc (12)

3- Back Loops Only (BLO)- sc in each around (12)

4-8- Both Loops, sc in each.

9- (2hdc in 1sc, hdc in 5sc) twice (14)

10- (2hdc in 2hdc, hdc in 5) twice (18)

11- (2hdc in 1, hdc in 2, 2hdc in 1, hdc in 5) twice (22)

12- hdc in 2, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 9, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 7 (26)

13- hdc in 3, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 11, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 8 (30)

14- hdc in 4, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 13, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 9 (34)

15- hdc in 5, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 15, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 10 (38)

16- hdc in 4, \*(2hdc in next, hdc in 1, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 1, 2hdc in 1)\*, hdc in 13, repeat from \*to\* once, hdc in 9 (46)

17- hdc in 6, \*(2hdc in 1, hdc in 1, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 1, 2hdc in 1)\*, hdc in 17, repeat from \*to\* once, hdc in 11 (54)

18- hdc in 10, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 25, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 15 (58)

19- hdc in 11, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 27, 2hdc in 2, hdc in 16 (62)

20-28- place marker on 1st hdc of row 20, increase in the same pattern till you have (98) hdc.

29- Continue in same increase pattern making every 7th hdc red, carry red loosely behind work, do not crochet red into olive, this will get felted in, do not cut red @ end of row (102)

30- Only Olive, follow increase pattern. (106)

31- Continue increase making every 5th hdc red (110)

32- Only Olive, hdc in each around, do not increase (110)

33- Hdc in each around making every 3rd hdc red (110)

34- Hdc in each making every 2nd hdc red.

35- RED ONLY, hdc in each.

36-44- RED ONLY, hdc in each.

45- Hdc in each making every 7th gold

46- Red Only, hdc in each

47- Hdc in each making every 5th gold

48- Red Only, hdc in each

49- Hdc in each making every 3rd gold

50- Hdc in each making every 2nd gold

51- GOLD ONLY, hdc in each

52- hdc in 41, hdc dec twice, hdc 49, hdc dec twice, hdc 10 (104)

53- hdc 40, hdc dec twice, hdc 47, hdc dec twice, hdc 9 (100)



54- hdc 39, hdc dec twice, hdc 45,  
hdc dec twice, hdc 8 (96)

55- hdc 38, hdc dec twice, hdc 43,  
hdc dec twice, hdc 7 (92)

56-60 Continue in established  
decrease (less 1 hdc, dec twice, less  
2hdc, dec twice, hdc rem st) until you  
have (72) hdc.

61- hdc 34, hdc dec twice, hdc 31,  
hdc dec twice (69)

62- hdc 32, hdc dec twice, hdc 29,  
hdc dec twice (65)

63- hdc 28, hdc dec four times, hdc  
23, hdc dec four times (59)

\*First Side opening\*

64- hdc 27, hdc dec, leave remaining  
undone (28)

65- ch2(counts as hdc now and  
throughout), turn, hdc dec, hdc 24,  
hdc dec. (26)

66- ch2, turn, hdc dec, hdc 21, hdc  
dec (24)

67- ch2, turn, hdc dec, hdc 19, hdc  
dec (22)

68- ch2, turn, hdc dec, hdc 17, hdc  
dec (20)

69-77- Continue in established  
decrease pattern until you have (1)  
hdc remaining (hdc dec on last row).  
Cut and weave in ends.

### **Second Side:**

This side will actually end one row

### **BEFORE FELTING:**

sl st veins on one side or both with  
Olive.

### **FELT:**

(I find my felted items pick up less  
"fuzz" when I put them into a  
pillowcase)- hang upside down and  
dry thoroughly.

Stuff, sew sides closed securely.

## Autumn Plant Pot Cuff

If you're looking to spruce up your house plants then this is the perfect crochet pattern for you. Make an autumn plant pot cuff. It's an easy crochet pattern that uses bright colors for the fall season.



**Crochet Hook:** G/6 or 4 mm hook

**Yarn Weight:** (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

### Materials:

- Small amounts of 4 ply WW yarn (dk brown, yellow, gold, orange)
- Crochet hook size G

### Finished Size:

6 ½" diameter x 5" tall

### Gauge:

2 rows = 1 1/2"

### INSTRUCTIONS:

#### Cuff:

Rnd 1) *Starting at bottom:* using dk brown, ch 4; (11 dc) in 4th ch from hook (first 3 chs skipped count as first dc); join with a sl st to first dc: 12 dc.

Rnd 2) Ch 3, dc in joining; \* (2 dc) in next dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 24 dc.

Rnd 3) Ch 3, (2 dc) in next dc; \* dc in next dc, (2 dc) in next dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 36 dc.

Rnd 4) Ch 3, dc in next dc, (2 dc) in next dc; \* dc in next 2 dc, (2 dc) in next dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 48 dc.

Rnd 5) Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, (2 dc) in next dc; \* dc in next 3 dc, (2 dc) in next dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 60 dc.

Rnd 6) Ch 3, dc in next 3 dc, (2 dc) in next dc; \* dc in next 4 dc, (2 dc) in

next dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 72 dc.

Rnd 7) (Working in back lps throughout) Starting up side: ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, (3 dc) in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc; \* dc in next 3 dc, (3 dc) in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 72 dc.

Rnd 8) Sl st in next dc, dropping dk brown and picking up yellow (end off dk brown); ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, (3 dc) in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc; \* dc in next 3 dc, (3 dc) in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc; rep from

\* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 72 dc.

Rnd 9) Sl st in next dc, ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, (3 dc) in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc; \* dc in next 3 dc, (3 dc) in next dc, dc in next 3 dc, sk next 2 dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st to first dc: 72 dc.

Rnds 10-13) Rep rnds 8 & 9 picking up gold for 2 rnds and then orange for the last 2 rnds. Fasten off; secure ends after last rnd: 72 dc.

**Finishing:**

Slip a 6" silk or real plant inside cuff.
