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## Christmas Crochet Patterns

## Snowflake Hostess Apron



Designed by Tammy Hildebrand.
RED HEART® Shimmer®: $2(2,3,3,4,4)$ balls 1929 Red A; and 1 (1, 2, 2, 3, 3) balls 1010 Snow B.

## Susan Bate® Crochet Hooks: 5mm [US H-8] and 6 mm [US J-10].

Yarn Needle.
GAUGES: 3 V-sts and $2 \mathrm{sc}=4$ " ( 10 cm ); 7 rows = $\mathbf{4 "}^{\prime \prime}$ $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ in skirt pattern; $13 \mathrm{sts}=4^{\prime \prime}(10 \mathrm{~cm})$; 15 rows $=4^{\prime \prime}(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ in sc; snowflake $=3^{1 / 41}(8 \mathrm{~cm})$ across.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hooks to obtain the gauges.

## Special Abbreviations

V-st $=$ (dc, ch 2, dc) in same space or st. sc2tog = [draw up a loop in next st] twice, yo and draw through all 3 loops on hook. Picot $=$ ch 3, slip st in 3rd ch from hook. J3 (join ch-3 spaces) $=$ ch 1, remove hook from loop, insert hook from the right side into corresponding ch3 space and into loop, drawing loop through, ch 1.

Directions are for size Small; changes for sizes Medium, Large, X-Large, XX-Large and XXXLarge are in parentheses.

To Fit Bust: 32-34 (36-38, 40-42, 44-46, 48-50, 5254)", [81-86 (91-97, 102-107, 111-117, 122-127, $132-137) \mathrm{cm}]$.

Bodice Width: $13^{1 ⁄ 1 / 4}(153 / 4,181 / 4,203 / 4,23,251 / 2)$ ", [ 34 (40, 4653, 58, 65) cm].

## APRON

Waistband
Snowflake [Make 6 (7, 8, 9, 10, 11)]
NOTE: After the first snowflake, all others are joined while working Round 3.

With B and smaller hook, ch 8; join with a slip st to form a ring.
Round 1: Ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around; join with a slip st in first sc - 16 sc.
Round 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 5, skip next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next sc] 7 times; join in first sc 8 ch-5 spaces.

## First Snowflake ONLY

Round 3: * Slip st in next 2 ch, (slip st, ch 3, slip st) in next ch, slip st in next 2 ch **, slip st in next sc; repeat from * around, end at **. Fasten off.

## Remaining Snowflakes

Joining Round 3: [Slip st in next 2 ch , joining to previous snowflake, (slip st, J3, slip st) in next ch,
slip st in next 2 ch, slip st in next sc] twice, * slip st in next 2 ch, (slip st, ch 3 , slip st) in next ch, slip st in next 2 ch **, slip st in next sc; repeat from * around, end at ${ }^{* *}$. Fasten off.

## Tie

Row 1: With right side facing and smaller hook, join B in right-hand ch-3 space of short end of snowflake strip; ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3 ), dc in same space, (dc, ch 3 , dc) in next ch-3 space; turn.

Rows 2-25 (2-26, 2-27, 2-28, 2-29, 2-30): Ch 1, (slip st, ch 6 , dc) in first ch-3 space, (dc, ch 3 , dc) in next ch-3 space; turn. Fasten off after last row.

## Skirt

Foundation Row: With right side facing and larger hook, join A with sc in ch-3 space on first snowflake; ch 3 , sc in next ch-3 space, * ch 7, sc in ch-3 space on next snowflake, ch 3 , sc in next ch-3 space; repeat from * across; turn - $12(14,16,18,20,22)$ sc and $6(7,8,9,10,11)$ ch- 3 spaces and $5(6,7,8$, $9,10)$ ch-7 spaces.

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each sc and ch across; turn - 65 (77, 89, 101, 113, 125) sc.
Row 2 (Right Side): Ch 1, sc in first sc, * skip next sc, V-st in next sc, skip next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * across; turn - 17 (20, 23, 26, 29, 32) sc and 16 (19, 22, 25, 28, 31) V-sts.
Row 3: Ch 5, dc in first sc (ch-5 and dc counts as Vst), * sc in next ch-2 space, V-st in next sc; repeat from * across; turn - 17 (20, 23, 26, 29, 32) V-sts.
Row 4: (Slip st, ch 1, sc) in first ch-2 space, * V-st in next sc, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from * across; turn.
Rows 5 and 6: Repeat Rows 3 and 4.
Row 7: Repeat Row 3.
Row 8: Ch 5, dc in first dc (increase made), sc in first ch-2 space, * V-st in next sc, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from * to end; V-st in 3rd ch of ch-5 (increase made); turn - 18 (21, 24, 27, 30, 33) V-sts. Row 9: Repeat Row 4.
Rows 10-13: Repeat Rows 3 and 4 twice.
Row 14: Repeat Row 3.
Row 15: Repeat Row 8 - 19 (22, 25, 28, 31, 34) V-
sts.
Rows 16-22: Repeat Rows 9-15-20 (23, 26, 29, 32, 35) V-sts.
Row 23: Repeat Row 4.
Rows 24-27 (24-27, 24-31, 24-31, 24-31, 24-31):
Repeat Rows 3 and 4 two ( $2,4,4,4,4$ ) times.
Row 28 (28, 32, 32, 32, 32): Repeat Row 3. Do not turn or fasten off after last row but pivot to work over post of sts at row ends.

## Skirt Border

## First Side

Ch 1,2 sc in each dc row and sc in each sc row up to waistband, slip st in ch-3 space on last snowflake - $42(42,48,48,48,48) ~ s c$. Fasten off.

## Second Side

With right side facing and larger hook, join $\mathbf{A}$ in outside ch-3 space of last snowflake on opposite end of waistband; ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each dc row and sc in each sc row to lower edge. Fasten off.

## Skirt Edging

With right side facing and larger hook, join $\mathbf{B}$ in same ch-3 space as Second Side of skirt border; * skip next sc, (slip st, picot) in next sc; repeat from * to corner; working in sts of last row of skirt, (slip st, 5 dc) in first ch-2 space, ** slip st in next sc, 5 dc in next ch-2 space; repeat from ** to next corner; (slip st, picot) in next sc on First Side of skirt border, skip next sc, *** (slip st, picot) in next sc, skip next sc; repeat from *** to waistband; slip st in ch-3 space on snowflake. Fasten off.

## Bodice

Row 1: With right side facing and larger hook, working in ch-3 spaces on opposite side of snowflakes, join $\mathbf{A}$ with sc in first ch-3 space, * ch 3, sc in next ch-3 space; repeat from * across; turn - 12 $(14,16,18,20,22)$ sc and 11 ( $13,15,17,19,21$ ) ch3 spaces.
Rows 2-4: Ch 1, sc in each sc and ch across; turn 45 (53, 61, 69, 77, 85) sc.
Row 5: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each sc to last 2 sc; sc2tog; turn - 43 ( $51,59,67,75,83$ ) sc.

Rows 6-17: Repeat Rows 2-5 three more times - 37 $(45,53,61,69,77)$ sc.
Rows 18-20: Repeat Rows 2-4.

Row 21: Ch 1, sc in first $10(14,18,22,26,30)$ sc, 4 sc in next sc, sc in next $15 \mathrm{sc}, 4 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc, sc in each sc to end; turn $-43(51,59,67,75,83)$ sc.
Rows 22-25: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn.
Row 26: Ch 1, sc in first $21(25,29,33,37,41)$ sc, sc2tog, sc in each sc to end; turn - 42 ( $50,58,66$, 74,82 ) sc.
Rows 27-28 (27-28, 27-30, 27-30, 27-32, 27-32):
Repeat Row 22.
Row 29 (29, 31, 31, 33, 33): Repeat Row 5 - 40 (48, $56,64,72,80$ ) sc.
Row 30 (30, 32, 32, 34, 34): Ch 1, sc in first 14 (18, $22,26,30,34) \mathrm{sc}$, slip st in next 12 sc , sc in each sc to end; turn.
Row 31: Ch 1, sc in first $12(16,20,24,28,32) \mathrm{sc}$, slip st in next 2 sc, slip st in next 12 slip sts, slip st in next 2 sc , sc in each sc to end; turn.

## First Neck Strap

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in first 8 sc ; TURN leaving remaining sts unworked.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each sc across; turn - 7 sc.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first 5 sc , sc2tog; turn - 6 sc.
Row 4: Repeat Row 2 - 5 sc.
Rows 5-91: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn. Fasten off after last row.

## Second Neck Strap

Row 1: With wrong side facing, skip next 24 (32, 40, $48,56,64$ ) sts of last long row; join A with sc in next sc , sc in each sc to end; turn - 8 sc .
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first 6 sc , sc2tog; turn - 7 sc .
Row 3: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in each sc across; turn - 6 sc.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first $4 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc} 2 \mathrm{tog}$; turn -5 sc .
Rows 5-91: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn. Fasten off after last row.

## Bodice Border

With right side facing and larger hook, join A with slip st in ch-3 space on last snowflake; working over row ends, sc in each sc row up to tie, slip st in each row of tie and in each sc across last row of tie and in each row end of second side, working in sts across last row of bodice, sc in each st, slip st in each row of second tie and in each sc across last row and in
each row of second side, working over row ends of second side of bodice, sc in each sc row, slip st in ch-3 space on snowflake. Fasten off.

## Bodice Edging

With right side facing and larger hook, join B with slip st in same ch-3 space on snowflake as border; skip next st, * (slip st, picot) in next st, skip next st; repeat from * to end; slip st in same ch-3 space on snowflake. Fasten off.

## Pocket

Round 1: With larger hook and B, ch 8; join with slip st to form ring; ch 1, (sc, ch 1) in each ch around; join with slip st in first sc - 8 sc and 8 ch- 1 spaces.
Round 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 5, [sc in next sc, ch 5] 7 times; join in first sc.
Round 3: Slip st in next ch-5 space, ch 3 (counts as dc), 5 dc in same space, 6 dc in each ch- 5 space around; join in top of ch-3-48 sts.
Round 4: Slip st in next 2 dc, * ch 3, slip st in next 3 dc, ch 1 **, slip st in next 3 dc; repeat from * around, end at **; join.
Round 5: Working over slip st of previous round, slip st in next 2 sts, * (slip st, [picot, slip st] twice) all in next ch-3 space, slip st in next 3 sts, slip st in next sc of Round 2 **, slip st in next 3 sts; repeat from * around, end at ${ }^{* *}$. Fasten off.

With yarn needle and $\mathbf{B}$, tack edges of pocket to skirt leaving top two points open using photo as guide for placement.

## Granny Tree Skirt

RED HEART® Super Saver®: 1 skein each of 334 Buff A, 322 Pale Yellow B, 256 Carrot C, 319 Cherry Red D, 378 Claret E, 358 Lavender F, 886 Blue G, 656 Real Teal H, 672 Spring Green I, 389 Hunter Green $\mathbf{J}$.

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: 6.5mm [US K-10.5]. Yarn needle, stitch marker.
GAUGE: 12 sts = 4"; 6 rows = 4 " in double crochet. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## NOTES

1. Skirt is made from thirteen pieces: an inner ring and twelve granny squares arranged around the outer edge of the inner ring.
2. The granny squares are not perfectly square; one edge is shorter than the other three edges. The
shorter edge is sewn to the outer edge of the inner ring.
Skirt measures 58" (147 cm) diameter, to fit around standard tree holder.


## INNER RING

With B, ch 140.
Row 1 (Right Side): 3 dc in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first dc), *skip next $2 \mathrm{ch}, 3$ dc in next ch; repeat from * across to last ch, dc in last ch-Forty-six 3-dc groups, and one dc on each end. Fasten off B.
Row 2: With Wrong Side facing, draw up a loop of G in the space between the first 2 dc , ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1 here and throughout), *3 dc in next space between 3-dc groups, ch 1; repeat from * across, dc in space between last dc and beginning ch-Fortyfive 3 -dc groups, $46 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces, and one dc on each end. Fasten off $\mathbf{G}$.
Row 3: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of C in first dc, ch $3,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in first ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 4 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space (increase made), *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 6 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * 4 more times, [ch 1, 3 dc in ch-1 space] 4 times, 3 dc in turning ch-space, dc in 3rd ch of beginning ch-Fifty-two 3-dc groups and

51 ch-1 spaces. Fasten off C.
Row 4: With Wrong Side facing, draw up a loop of $\mathbf{A}$ in the space between the first $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 4,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch- 1 space, [ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space] 8 times, ch 1 , ( 3 dc , ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space, *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 15 times, ( 3 dc , ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * once more, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 9 times, dc in space between last dc and beginning ch-Fifty-four 3-dc groups and $55 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces. Fasten off $\mathbf{A}$.
Row 5: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of $\mathbf{F}$ in first dc, ch $3,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in first ch-1 space, [ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space] 4 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch- 1 space (increase made), [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch- 1 space] 8 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 space, *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 7 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 8 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * once more, [ch 1,3 dc in ch-1 space] 5 times, 3 dc in turning ch-space, dc in 3rd ch of beginning ch-Sixty-one 3-dc groups and $60 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces. Fasten off $\mathbf{F}$.
Row 6: With Wrong Side facing, draw up a loop of I in the space between the first $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 4,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 9 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space, *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 18 times, ( $3 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * once more, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 11 times, dc in space between last dc and beginning ch-Sixty-three 3-dc groups and 64 ch- 1 spaces. Fasten off I.
Row 7: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of D in first dc, ch 3, 3 dc in first ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 5 times, ch 1 , ( 3 dc , ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch- 1 space (increase made), [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 10 times, ch 1, ( 3 dc , ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-1 space, *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 8 times, ch 1 , ( 3 dc , ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space, [ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space] 10 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * once more, [ch 1,3 dc in ch-1 space] 5 times, 3 dc in turning ch-space, dc in 3rd ch of beginning ch-Seventy 3-dc groups and 69 ch- 1 spaces. Fasten off $\mathbf{D}$.
Row 8: With Wrong Side facing, draw up a loop of $\mathbf{E}$ in the space between the first $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 4,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch- 1 space, [ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space] 11 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space, *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 21 times, ( 3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * once more, [ch 1, 3
dc in next ch-1 space] 12 times, dc in space between last dc and beginning ch-Seventy-two 3-dc groups and $73 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces. Fasten off $\mathbf{E}$.
Row 9: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of $\mathbf{G}$ in first dc, ch 3, 3 dc in first ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 3 times, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 space (increase made), *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch -1 space] 7 times, ch 1, ( 3 dc , ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * 7 more times, [ch 1, 3 dc in ch-1 space] 3 times, 3 dc in turning ch-space, dc in 3rd ch of beginning ch-Eighty-two 3-dc groups and 81 ch- 1 spaces. Fasten off G.
Row 10: With Wrong Side facing, draw up a loop of H in the space between the first 2 dc , ch $4,{ }^{*} 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space, ch 1; repeat from * across, dc in space between last dc and beginning ch-Eightyone 3 -dc groups and 82 ch- 1 spaces. Fasten off $\mathbf{H}$. Row 11: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of $\mathbf{A}$ in first dc, ch 3,3 dc in first ch-1 space, [ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch- 1 space] twice, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space (increase made), [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 5 times, *ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 8 times; repeat from * 7 more times, ch 1,3 dc in turning chspace, dc in 3rd ch of beginning ch-Ninety-one 3dc groups and $90 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces. Fasten off A.
Row 12: With Wrong Side facing, draw up a loop of C in the space between the first 2 dc , ch $4, * 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space, ch 1; repeat from * across, dc in space between last dc and beginning ch-Ninety 3dc groups and 91 ch-1 spaces. Fasten off $\mathbf{C}$.
Row 13: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of B in first dc, ch 3, 3 dc in first ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 13 times, ch 1 , ( 3 dc , ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space (increase made), *[ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 14 times, ch 1 , ( 3 dc , ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-1 space; repeat from * 3 more times, [ch 1, 3 dc in ch- 1 space] 15 times, 3 dc in turning ch-space, dc in 3rd ch of beginning ch-Ninety-six 3-dc groups and 95 ch- 1 spaces. Fasten off B.
Row 14: With Wrong Side facing, draw up a loop of F in the space between the first 2 dc , ch $4,{ }^{*} 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 space, ch 1 ; repeat from * across, dc in space between last dc and beginning ch-Ninetyfive 3 -dc groups and 96 ch- 1 spaces. Fasten off $\mathbf{F}$. Row 15: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of $\mathbf{J}$ in first dc, ch 3, 3 dc in first ch-1 space, *ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space; repeat from * across to last ch-1 space, ch 1, 3 dc in turning ch-space, dc in 3rd ch of
beginning ch—Ninety-six 3-dc groups and 95 ch-1 spaces. Fasten off J.

## GRANNY SQUARE (make 12)

## Notes:

1. Make one granny square in each of the color sequences listed.
2. Squares are worked in joined rounds with Right

Side facing at all times.
3. Ch-1 spaces are worked between the 3-dc groups across 3 edges of each square. No ch- 1 spaces are worked between the 3-dc groups across one edge of each square (the top of the square). This shapes each square so that it is slightly narrower at the top than at the bottom.
4. Each round is worked with a different color.

Fasten off old color at the end of each round.
5. To reduce the number of tails to weave in later, crochet over the ends as you go.

## Color Sequences

Square \#1: C, D, B, A, E, F, G, I, J, H.
Square \#2: J, G, A, I, B, F, D, H, E, C.
Square \#3: I, D, F, H, C, G, B, E, A, J.
Square \#4: F, E, J, H, G, I, C, D, A, B.
Square \#5: A, B, C, F, D, J, E, H, G, I.
Square \#6: G, H, I, J, F, E, C, B, A, D.
Square \#7: H, I, B, D, C, E, G, A, J, F.
Square \#8: D, J, F, A, C, B, I, G, H, E.
Square \#9: F, D, I, J, G, H, E, A, B, C.
Square \#10: B, C, F, I, G, D, A, H, E, J.
Square \#11: A, I, H, D, E, B, F, C, J, G.
Square \#12: E, G, J, I, H, F, D, B, C, A.
With first color, ch 5 ; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring.
Round 1 (Right Side): Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), 2 dc in ring, [ch 1, 3 dc in ring] 3 times, ch 1 ; join with slip st in top of beginning ch12 dc and $4 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces. Fasten off first color.
Round 2: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of 2nd color in any ch-1 space, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch-1 space, ( 3 dc , ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in each of next $3 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces, 3 dc in same ch-1 space as joining, ch 1; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-24 dc and 4 ch-1 spaces. Fasten off 2nd color.
Round 3: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of 3rd color in any ch-1 space, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch-1 space, 3 dc in next space between 3-dc groups, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc ) in next ch-1 space (corner made),
place a marker in the 3-dc group before the corner for top edge of square, *ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next space between 3-dc groups, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-1 space (corner made); repeat from * once more, ch 1, 3 dc in next space between 3-dc groups, ch 1, 3 dc in same ch-1 space as joining, ch 1 ; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-4 corners and one 3dc group on each side. Fasten off 3rd color.
Round 4: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of 4th color in first corner ch-1 space, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch-1 space, 3 dc in each space between 3-dc groups across to next corner ch-1 space, ( 3 dc , ch 1, 3 dc ) in corner ch-1 space, [ ${ }^{*}$ ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space; repeat from * across to next corner ch-2 space, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc ) in corner ch-2 space] twice, **ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space; repeat from ** across to first corner ch-1 space, ch 1, 3 dc in same ch- 1 space as joining, ch 1 ; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-4 corners and two 3-dc groups on each side.
Fasten off 4th color.
Rounds 5-10: Repeat Round 4 six times and continue to change color every round as in color sequence-4 corners and eight 3-dc groups on each side at the end of Round 10. Note: If desired, join in a different corner ch-space for each round and work as for Round 4, taking care not to work ch-1 spaces between the 3-dc groups across the top edge of the square, and working ch-1 spaces between the 3 -dc groups across the other 3 edges. Work (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) for each top corner, and (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc ) for each lower corner.

## FINISHING

Arrange granny squares around outer edge of inner ring, as shown in Assembly Diagram. Take care to place shorter (marked) edge of each granny square next to edge of inner ring. Match the ten 3-dc groups across the top edge of each granny square with eight 3-dc groups (and the ch-1 spaces between the $3-d c$ groups) of outer edge of inner ring. Sew the granny squares together and to the inner ring. The designer recommends sewing the squares together in groups of three and then sewing the group of three to the inner ring.

## Outer Border

Row 1 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, join D in outer corner of ring of granny squares, to work
across outer edge, ch 2 , work 1 hdc in each dc, 1 hdc in each ch- 1 space, and 2 hdc in each corner ch-2 space (where squares are joined) all the way across outer edge. Fasten off.
Row 2 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, join E in top of beginning ch-2 of Row 1, ch 1, working in back loops only slip st in each hdc across. Note: Work with relaxed tension so as not to pull in the outer edge. Fasten off.

## Inner Border

Row 1 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, join D in inner corner of inner ring, to work across inner edge, ch 2 , 2 hdc in each space between 3 -dc groups all the way across inner edge, DO NOT TURN.
Row 2: Working in the opposite direction (without turning piece, to work reverse hdc sts), ch 2, work hdc in each space between 2 -dc groups across, slip st in beginning ch-2 of Row 1.
Fasten off.

## Side Borders

Row 1 (Right Side): With Right Side facing, join D in corner, to work across side edge, hdc evenly spaced across side edge, DO NOT TURN.
Row 2: Ch 1, reverse sc in each st across. Fasten off. Repeat across other side edge. Weave in any remaining ends. Lay skirt flat on floor around tree holder, and pat into position. Note any areas that may need blocking. Block piece very, very lightly, if needed.

Fasten off B.

Sequence \#1 (make 7 more): 1 round $\mathbf{C}$, 2 rounds $\mathbf{A}, 1$ round $\mathbf{C}, 1$ round $\mathbf{B}$.
Sequence \#2 (make 12): 3 rounds B, 1 round C, 1 round $\mathbf{A}$.
Sequence \#3 (make 24): 3 rounds A, 1 round C, 1 round $\mathbf{B}$.
Sequence \#4 (make 24): 1 round A, 2 rounds B, 1 round $\mathbf{C}$, 1 round $\mathbf{A}$.
Sequence \#5 (make 12): 1 round B, 2 rounds A, 1 round $\mathbf{C}, 1$ round $\mathbf{B}$.
Sequence \#6 (make 1): 1 round C, 2 rounds B, 1 round $\mathbf{C}$, 1 round $\mathbf{A}$.
Work Rounds 1-4 of first motif, with specified color sequences. Refer to assembly diagram for placement of next motif.
Round 5 (RS): Join last color in any ch-8 space, ch $5,6 \mathrm{dc}$ in same ch-8 space, ch 1 , sc in next ch-4 space, ch 4 , sc in next ch-4 space, ch 1 , * 6 dc in next ch-8 space, ch 1, slip st in corresponding ch-2 space of neighbor, ch $1,6 \mathrm{dc}$ in same ch- 8 space of current motif, ch 1, sc in next ch-4 space, ch 2, slip st in corresponding ch-4 space of neighbor, ch 2, sc in next ch-4 space, ch 1 ; repeat from *if there is a 2nd neighbor, 6 dc in next ch-8 space, ch 1, slip st in corresponding ch-2 space of neighbor, ch $1,6 \mathrm{dc}$ in same ch-8 space of current motif, work across

Fasten off.
Round 2 (RS): Join C in any corner ch-2 space of throw, ch 3 (counts as hdc, ch 1), hdc in same ch-2 space, ch 1, *hdc in next ch-1 space, ch 1; repeat from * around, working (hdc, ch 2, hdc) in each corner; join with slip st in 2nd ch of beginning ch. Fasten off.
Round 3: With A, repeat Round 2.

Round 4: With C, repeat Round 2.
Round 5 (RS): Join A in any corner ch-2 space of throw, ch 4, dc in same ch-2 space, ch 1, *dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1 ; repeat from * around, working (dc, ch 2, dc) in each corner; join with slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch. Do not fasten off.
Last Round: *Ch 3, slip st in next dc; repeat from * around, ch 3, slip st in base of beginning ch. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

## SCARF

With smaller hook, loosely ch 198.
Row 1: Tr in 5th ch from hook and in each ch
across; turn - 195 sts.
Rows 2, 4 and 6: Ch 3 (counts as 1 hdc and ch-1), * skip next tr, hdc in next tr, ch 1; repeat from * to last 2 sts; skip next tr, hdc in top of ch-4; turn - 97 ch-1 spaces.
Rows 3 and 5: Ch 4, skip first hdc, * tr in next space, tr in next hdc; repeat from * across working last tr in 2nd ch of ch-3; turn.
Row 7: Repeat Row 3. Fasten off.

## Form Pockets

Fold each short edge at 15th tr to form 2 pockets (each approximately 5 " deep) and pin or baste loosely in position, lining up the $7 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces of front and back.

## Picot Edging

With pocket opening facing you and smaller hook, join yarn to corner of pocket (the 15th tr) and work across long edge working through 2 layers to secure pocket as follows: ch 3, * skip 1 st, hdc in next st, ch 3 , sc around post of hdc to form picot, ch 1 ; repeat from * across, end ch 1, hdc in corner (the 15th tr). Fasten off.

In same way, work Edging across opposite long edge. Weave in ends.

## Trim (Make 2)

With larger hook, make a ch 20" long; slip st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Weave through $2 n d$ set of ch-1 spaces from top of pocket, going in through first space on the right, then out through 3rd space on left. Even up lengths and tie loosely in double knot. Knot ends of ch.

Fasten off.

## Poinsettia Flower

Round 1: With C leaving a $12^{\prime \prime}(30 \mathrm{~cm})$ yarn tail, make an adjustable loop; 6 sc into loop; join with a slip st in first sc. Pull on yarn tail to tighten loop and close center.

Round 2: * Ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook and next 3 ch **, slip st in next sc; repeat from * around, end at **.

Round 3: * Slip st in next ch, hdc in next ch, slip st in next 2 ch, ch 3, slip st in 3rd ch from hook, slip st in next 2 sc, hdc in next sc, slip st in next sc, skip next slip st; repeat from * around. Fasten off.

## Poinsettia Leaf

Work as for flower with B.

## Holly Leaves (Make 8)

Round 1: With B, ch 7; slip st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next 2 ch , sc in next ch, slip st in last ch changing to $\mathbf{A}$; continue on opposite side of ch: [slip st in next ch, ch 2, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in next ch] 3 times, ch 2, slip st in 2nd ch from hook; now work across original sts: [slip st in next st, ch 2, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in next st] 3 times. Fasten off leaving a long yarn tail.

## Finishing

Sew center of poinsettia to center of poinsettia leaves, staggering petals and leaves. With A, sew center of poinsettia to one end of collar with French knots in the center of the flower.

Wrap the collar around animal's neck to determine how much overlap there should be and mark with safety pin or removable stitch marker. With sewing needle and thread sew male side of snap to underside of collar underneath poinsettia; sew other half of snap near opposite end and opposite side of collar so that when snapped together, there is desired amount of overlap. With sewing needle and thread, stitch remaining snap to secure under lap of collar.

Sew leaves to collar as desired. Weave in ends.

Round 2: Ch 3, dc in next dc, V-st in next dc, [dc in next 2 dc , V -st in next dc] 4 times; join - 5 V -sts, 10 dc.

Round 3: Ch 3, dc in next dc, * ch 2, CL in next ch-2 space, ch $2{ }^{* *}$, dc in next 2 dc; repeat from * around, end at **; join - 5 CL, 10 dc .
Round 4: Ch 3, dc in next st, * [ch 1, V-st in ch-2 space] twice, ch $1^{* *}$, dc in next 2 dc; repeat from * around, end at **; join.
Round 5: Ch 3, dc in next dc, * ch 1, CL in ch-2 space, ch $1,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in ch-2 space, ch $1, \mathrm{CL}$ in ch-2 space, ch $1^{* *}$, dc in next 2 dc ; repeat from * around, end at **; join.
Round 6: Ch 3, dc in next dc, * V-st in next CL **, dc in next 2 dc ; repeat from * around, end at **; join.
Round 7: Ch 3, dc in next dc, * ch 2, CL in next ch-2 space, ch $2{ }^{* *}$, dc in next 2 dc; repeat from * around, end at **; join.
Infant size only: fasten off.
Toddler and Child Sizes Only-Round 8: Ch 3, (1, 2) dc in next dc, * V-st in next CL **, dc in next dc, $(1,2)$ dc in next dc; repeat from * around, end at **; join. Fasten off.
All Sizes-Round 8 (9, 9): Join B in any st; ch 1, work $55(60,70)$ sc evenly spaced around; join with a slip st in first sc.
Rounds 9-13 (10-13, 10-13): Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join.
Round 14: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 5, skip 4 sc ; [sc in next sc, ch 5, skip 4 sc] $10(11,13)$ times; join. Fasten off.
Round 15: Join A with sc in a skipped sc on Round 13 next to an sc of Round 14; * working BEHIND the ch-5 loop, ch 5, skip 4 sts (including a used st) ${ }^{* *}$, sc in next sc in FRONT of ch-5 loop; repeat from * around, end at **; join. Fasten off.

## Small Flower

Round 1: With B, ch 6; join in first ch to form a ring; ch $1,7 \mathrm{sc}$ in ring; join with slip st in first sc -7 sc .
Round 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around; join - 14 sc.
Round 3: (Ch 3, 4 tr, ch 3, slip st) all in first sc, * skip next sc **, (slip st, ch 3, 4 tr, ch 3, slip st) all in next sc; repeat from * around, end at ** -7 petals. Fasten off.

## Large Flower

Round 1: With B, ch 6; join in first ch to form a ring; ch $3,13 \mathrm{dc}$ in ring; join with slip st in first dc -14 dc . Round 2: Ch 3, dc in same st, 2 dc in each dc around; join - 28 dc .
Round 3: Repeat Round 3 of Small Flower - 14 petals. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Place small flower on top of large flower and secure with button. Sew onto hat with yarn needle and $\mathbf{B}$.

Round 4: Ch 1, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 2 hdc] around, work hdc in last 2 hdc ; join -42 hdc.
Round 5: Ch 1, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 6 hdc] around; join - 48 hdc.
Fasten off. Weave in all ends.

## Front Medium Circle

Rounds 1-3: With B (F, C), repeat Rounds 1-3 of Front Large Circle.
Round 4: Ch 1, sc loosely in each hdc around; join with slip st in first sc - 32 sc.
Fasten off. Weave in all ends.

## Front Small Circle

With C (B, A), ch 4; join with slip st in first ch to form ring.
Round 1: Ch 1, 10 hdc in ring; join - 10 hdc.
Round 2: Ch 2 (does not count as first dc), [2 dc in next hdc, FPdc in next hdc] around; join with slip st in first dc - 10 dc , 5 FPdc.
Fasten off. Weave in all ends.

## BACK (Make 3)

With A (E, D), repeat instruction for Front Large Circle; draw up loop, do not fasten off.

## FINISHING

With C (B, A), slip st Front Small Circle to center of Front Medium Circle; with B (F, C), slip st Front Medium Circle to center of Front Large Circle.

Place assembled Front Large Circle and Back Wrong Sides together; with Right Side facing, draw working loop of Back through corresponding hdc of Front Large Circle; sc evenly around through both layers, leaving a

GAUGE: 13 sts $=4$ " $(10 \mathrm{~cm}) ; 5$ rows $=3^{\prime \prime}(8 \mathrm{~cm})$ in double crochet; one block measures about $8 \times 8$ " square. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

## Notes:

1. Throw is made from 30 squares: 15 each of Square A and Square B.
2. Squares $A$ and $B$ are made the same using different color sequences.
3. Squares are worked in joined rounds with Right Side facing at all times.

Round 1 (Right Side): Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), [dc in ring, ch 1] 5 times, tr in ring, [ch 1, dc in ring] 5 times, ch 1 ; join with slip st in 2nd ch of beginning ch- $1 \mathrm{tr}, 11 \mathrm{dc}$, and $12 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces. Fasten off.
Round 2: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of B in first ch-1 space, ch 2 (counts as hdc here and throughout), 2 dc in same ch-1 space, 3 tr in next ch1 space, 2 tr in next ch-1 space, 2 dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{ch}-1$ spaces, (dc, tr) in next ch-1 space, tr in next tr , ( tr , dc) in next ch-1 space, 2 dc in each of next 2 ch-1 spaces, 2 tr in next ch-1 space, 3 tr in next ch-1 space, (2 dc, hdc) in last ch-1 space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-29 sts.
Round 3: Ch 2, dc in next st, 2 dc in each of next 3 sts, dc in next st, hdc in next 8 sts, 3 dc in next tr (for lower tip of heart), hdc in next 8 sts, dc in next st, 2 dc in each of next 3 sts, dc in next st, hdc in last st; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-37 sts. Fasten off.
Round 4: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of C in center dc of 3-dc group at lower tip of heart, [ch 3, skip next st, sc in next st] 8 times, ch 3, dc around post of beginning ch of Round 1 drawing up a long loop so fabric does not pucker, ch 3, skip next 4 sts of Round 3 , sc in next st, [ch 3, skip next st, sc in next st] 7 times, ch 3 ; end with sc in center dc of 3dc lower tip-18 ch-3 spaces. Fasten off.
Round 5: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of A in first ch-3 space (at lower tip of heart), ch 2, (hdc, dc) in same ch-3 space, (dc, 2 tr) in next ch-3 space, (2 tr, ch 1, 2 tr ) in next ch-3 space (corner made), (tr, 3 dc ) in next ch-3 space, 4 dc in each of next 2 ch-3 spaces, ( 2 dc , ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-3 space (corner made), 3 dc in each of next $4 \mathrm{ch}-3$
spaces, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc ) in next ch-3 space (corner made), 4 dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{ch}-3$ spaces, ( 3 dc , tr) in next ch-3 space, (2 tr, ch 1, 2 tr ) in next ch-3 space (corner made), ( $\mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-3 space, (dc, 2 hdc) in last ch-3 space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-64 sts and 4 corner ch-spaces (16 sts between corner ch-spaces).
Round 6: Ch 3, dc in each st around, working (2 dc, ch 2,2 dc) in each corner ch-space; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-80 dc and 4 corner ch-2 spaces ( 20 sts between corner ch-spaces).
Round 7: Slip st in next st, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), skip next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, skip next dc, dc in next dc] 3 times, ch 1, skip next dc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in corner ch-2 space, *[ch 1, skip next dc, dc in next dc] 10 times, ch 1, (dc, ch 2, dc) in corner ch-2 space; repeat from * 2 more times, [ch 1, skip next dc, dc in next dc] 5 times, ch 1, slip st in 3rd ch of beginning $\mathrm{ch}-48 \mathrm{dc}$ and 48 ch -spaces. Fasten off.

## SQUARE B (make 15)

Make same as Square A, changing color as in following sequence: Work Round 1 with C, Rounds 2 and 3 with A, Round 4 with $\mathbf{C}$, Rounds $5-7$ with B.


## FINISHING

Arrange squares into 6 horizontal strips of 5 squares each. Alternate squares $A$ and squares $B$ across, for 3 strips beginning and ending with square $A$, and 3 strips beginning and ending with square $B$, as shown
in assembly diagram.
Join Squares in Horizontal Strips: Hold neighboring squares with Wrong Sides together and work from the Right Side. Match the dc sts and ch-1 spaces of the squares. Join $\mathbf{B}$ with sc in the beginning corner ch-2 space, ch 1, sc in next chspace, *ch 1, sc in next ch-space; repeat from * across to join squares. Fasten off. Take care to work evenly and not to tighten up. Repeat this process to join all 5 squares into one horizontal strip. Repeat to make all 6 horizontal strips.
Join Horizontal Strips: With A, join the long edges of neighboring horizontal strips together in same way as squares were joined.

## Border

Round 1: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of A in any corner ch-2 space, ch 3, dc in same ch-2 space, work 2 dc in each ch- 1 space, 1 dc in each join between squares, and ( 2 dc , ch 2, 2 dc ) in each corner ch-2 space around; to end, work 2 dc in same ch-2 space as beginning, ch 2; join with slip st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off.
Round 2: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of B in any corner ch-2 space, ch 2, hdc in same ch-2 space, hdc in each dc to next corner ch-2 space, (2 hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in corner ch-2 space, hdc in each dc to next corner ch-2 space, 2 hdc in corner ch-2 space; change to $\mathbf{C}$, ch 2,2 hdc in same corner ch-2 space, hdc in each dc to next corner ch-2 space, (2 hdc, ch 2,2 hdc) in corner ch-2 space, hdc in each dc to next corner ch-2 space, 2 hdc in same ch-2 space as beginning, ch 2; join with slip st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off.
Round 3: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of A in any corner ch-2 space, ch 3 (counts as hdc, ch 1), skip next hdc, hdc in next hdc, *ch 1, skip next hdc, hdc in next hdc; repeat from * evenly around, working (hdc, ch 2, hdc) in each corner ch-2 space; to end, work ch 2; join with slip st in 2nd ch of beginning ch-3. Fasten off.

## Corner Floral Trim

Corner Flower: With Right Side facing, join B with sc around post of first hdc of any corner in Round 2 of border, [ch 10, sc around post of same hdc] 3 times, ch 10, sc in ch-2 corner space of Round 1, [ch 10, sc in same ch-2 space of Round 1] 3 times, ch 10, sc around post of last hdc of same corner in

Round 2, [ch 10, sc around post of same hdc] 3 times. Fasten off.
Corner Leaves: With Right Side facing, working behind the corner flower, join A with sc in corner ch2 space of Round 3, [ch 10, sc in same ch-2 space] 5 times. Fasten off. With Right Side facing, join A with sc in ch-1 space of Round 3 three spaces before the corner space (to work towards the corner space), *[ch 10, sc in same ch-1 space] 3 times, ch 10 , sc in next ch-space; repeat from * 2 more times working the last sc in the corner ch-space behind and between the sc sts already worked into the space; **ch 10 , sc in next ch-1 space, [ch 10 , sc in same ch-1 space] 3 times; repeat from ** 2 more times. Fasten off.
Finish Edges between Corner Floral Trim: With Right Side facing, draw up a loop of $\mathbf{A}$ in ch-1 space before corner leaves (to work in opposite direction towards previous corner floral trim), ch 2, working in
opposite direction, hdc in each ch-1 space across to previous corner floral trim. Fasten off. Repeat to finish remaining three edges. Note: If you are righthanded, working in opposite direction means that you will work from left to right. If you are left-handed it means that you will work from right to left.
Weave in ends.

RED HEART® Holiday®: 1 ball 1360 Aran/Gold.
Susan Bates® Knitting Needles: 4.5 mm [US 7]
Cable needle, stitch holder, 7 buttons, sewing needle and thread, yarn needle.

GAUGE: 27 sts = 4" (10 cm); 22 rows = 4" (10 cm), in $2 \times 2$ Rib. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

Special Stitches
3/3 LC = 3 over 3 Left Cross - Slip next 3 sts to cable needle and hold in front, k3; then k3 from cable needle.
M1 = Make 1 (Increase) - Lift strand between needles to left-hand needle and knit strand through the back loop, twisting it to prevent a hole.
$\mathbf{s k 2 p}=$ Slip next stitch knitwise to right needle,
k2tog, lift slipped st over the k2tog st and off needle.
Cozy measures $12^{1 / 2 "}(32 \mathrm{~cm})$ tall.

## COZY

Cuff
Cast on 40 sts.
Row 1 (Right Side): Slip 1, k4, *p2, k2; repeat from * to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 2: Slip 1, *k2, p2; repeat from * to last 3 sts, k3.
Row 3 (buttonhole row): Slip 1, k1, yo, k2tog
(buttonhole made), k1, *p2, k2; repeat from * to last 3 sts, k3.
Row 4: Repeat Row 2.

## Body

Row 1 (Right Side): Slip 1, *k2, M1; repeat from * to last 3 sts, k3-58 sts.
Row 2: Slip 1, k2, [p2, k2, p6, k2] 4 times, p2, k5.
Row 3: Slip 1, k2, p2, [k2, p2, 3/3 LC, p2] 4 times, k5.
Row 4: Repeat Row 2.
Row 5: Slip 1, k2, p2, [k2, p2, k6, p2] 4 times, k5.
Rows 6 and 7: Repeat Rows 4 and 5.
Row 8: Repeat Row 4.
Row 9 (buttonhole row): Slip 1, k1, yo, k2tog, p1, [k2, p2, 3/3 LC, p2] 4 times, k5.
Rows 10-14: Repeat Rows 4-8.
Row 15: Repeat Row 3.
Rows 16-18: Repeat Rows 6-8.
Row 19 (buttonhole row): Slip 1, k1, yo, k2tog, p1, [k2, p2, k6, p2] 4 times, k5.
Rows 20-26: Repeat Rows 2-8.
Row 27: Repeat Row 3.
Row 28: Repeat Row 2.
Row 29 (buttonhole row): Repeat Row 19.
Rows 30 and 31: Repeat Rows 4 and 5.
Repeat Rows 2-31 once more (a total of 7 buttonholes made).
Repeat Rows 2-7 until piece measures 10 " from beginning, end with a Row 4 or 6 .

## Pocket Opening

Row 1 (Right Side): Slip 1, k2, p2, k2, p2, k6, p2, slip last 10 sts worked onto st holder, [k2, p2, k6, p2] 3 times, k5.
Row 2: Slip 1, k2, [p2, k2, p6, k2] 3 times, p2, cast on 10 sts, p2, k5.
Continue in pattern as established until piece
measures $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " from beginning or to desired height for bottle, end with a Wrong Side row.
Bind off 3 sts at the beginning of the next 2 rows- 52 sts.

## Bottom

Row 1 (Right Side): K2, [K1, sk2p, k5, sk2p] 4 times, k2-36 sts.
Row 2: Purl.
Row 3: K1, sk2p, k3, sk2p, [k5, sk2p] 3 times, k226 sts.
Row 4: Purl.
Row 5: [K3, sk2p] 4 times, k2-18 sts.
Row 6: Purl.
Row 7: [K1, sk2p] 4 times, k2-10 sts.
Cut yarn leaving a long tail. With yarn needle, thread tail through remaining 10 sts and pull to close
opening. Overlap first and last 3 sts of side edges, placing buttonholes on outside. Sew from center of bottom to just below last buttonhole.

## POCKET

Return pocket sts from holder to needle. Work in established cable pattern for 2 " ( 5 cm ). Bind off. Sew inside of pocket to Wrong Side of cozy.

## FINISHING

Weave in ends. Sew buttons opposite buttonholes.

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook: $5 \mathrm{~mm}[\mathrm{H}-8]$
Yarn needle.

GAUGE: 20 sts = 4" (10 cm), 26 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Stockinette Stitch. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

## Notes:

1. Slip all sts as if to purl.
2. The Heel is worked in short rows.
3. Carry color not in use loosely on the wrong side of your work.

## Special Stitches

Bobble - (K1, yo, K1, yo, K1) in next stitch, turn; P5, turn; K5, (insert left needle into the second stitch on right needle, passing it over the previously worked stitch and off the needle) 4 times.

## BOBBLE STOCKING

With double pointed needles and A, cast on 20 sts, leaving a 12" ( 30 cm ) end for sewing. Join, being careful that sts are not twisted, and begin working in the round. Place marker for beginning of round.
Round 1 (Right side): (K1, P1) around.
Rounds 2 and 3: (K1, P1) around.
Rounds 4 and 5: Knit around.
Round 6: K5, drop A, with B work bobble, drop B, with A knit around, cut B.
Rounds 7-9: Knit around.
Round 10: K 10, drop A, with B work bobble, drop B, with A knit around, cut B.
Rounds 11-13: Knit around.
Round 14: K 16, drop A, with B work bobble, drop B, with A knit around, cut B.
Rounds 15-17: Knit around, remove marker.

## Heel

Row 1: K4, turn, leaving remaining sts unworked.
Row 2: Slip 1, P7, turn.
Row 3: Slip 1, K6, turn.
Row 4: Slip 1, P5, turn.
Row 5: Slip 1, K4, slip 1, lift strand between needles to right needle, Knit strand and slipped st tog, turn.
Row 6: Slip 1, P4, slip 1, lift strand between needles
to right needle, Purl strand and slipped st together, turn.
Row 7: Slip 1, K5, slip 1, lift strand between needles
to right needle, Knit strand and slipped st together, turn.
Row 8: Slip 1, P5, slip 1, lift strand between needles to right needle, Purl strand and slipped st together, turn.
Row 9: Slip 1, K4, place marker to indicate beginning of round.

## Foot

Rounds 1-3: Knit around.
Round 4: K7, drop A, with B, work bobble, drop B, with $\mathbf{A}$ knit around, cut $\mathbf{B}$.
Rounds 5-9: Knit around.
Round 10: (K2, K2tog) around: 15 sts.
Round 11: Knit around.
Round 12: (K1, K2tog) around: 10 sts.
Round 13: Knit around.
Round 14: K2tog around: 5 sts.
Cut yarn, leaving a 12" ( 30 cm ) end. Thread yarn needle with end and weave through remaining stitches. Draw up firm; fasten securely.

## Hanging Loop

With crochet hook, using cast on end, and working from cast on edge, ch 8 . Fasten off. Thread yarn needle with remaining end, fold chain in half to form Loop, and secure end to cast on edge.

## STRIPED STOCKING

end of Round 15.
Rounds 16 and 17: With A, knit around, drop A at end of Round 17.
Round 18: With B, knit around, remove marker.

## Heel

Row 1: K4, turn, leaving remaining sts unworked.
Row 2: Slip 1, P7, turn.
Row 3: Slip 1, K6, turn.
Row 4: Slip 1, P5, turn.
Row 5: Slip 1, K4, slip 1, lift strand between needles to right needle, Knit strand and slipped st together, turn.
Row 6: Slip 1, P4, slip 1, lift strand between needles to right needle, Purl strand and slipped st together, turn.
Row 7: Slip 1, K5, slip 1, lift strand between needles to right needle, Knit strand and slipped st together, turn.
Row 8: Slip 1, P6, slip 1, lift strand between needles to right needle, Purl strand and slipped st together, turn.
Row 9: Slip 1, K3, place marker to indicate
beginning of round.

## Foot

Round 1: Knit around.
Rounds 2 and 3: With C, knit around, drop C at end of Round 3.
Rounds 4 and 5: With D, knit around, drop D at end of Round 5 .
Rounds 6 and 7: With A, knit around, cut A at end of Round 7.
Rounds 8 and 9: With B, knit around, cut B at end of Round 9.
Round 10: With C, (K2, K2tog) around: 15 sts.
Round 11: Knit around, cut C.
Round 12: With D, (K1, K2tog) around: 10 sts.
Round 13: Knit around
Round 14: K2tog around: 5 sts.
Cut yarn, leaving a 12" ( 30 cm ) end. Thread yarn needle with end and weave through remaining stitches. Draw up firm; fasten securely.

Row 2 and all Wrong Side rows: Purl.
Row 3: K1, *k5, k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k162 (68) sts.
Row 5: K1, *k4, k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k152 (57) sts.
Row 7: K1, *k3, k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k142 (46) sts.
Row 9: K1, *k2, k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k132 (35) sts.
Row 11: K1, *k1, k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k122 (24) sts.
Row 13: K1, *k2tog; repeat from * to last st, k1-12 (13) sts.

Row 15: K1, *k2tog; repeat from * to last 1 (2) sts, k1 (2)-7 (8) sts.
Cut yarn, leaving a long tail (about 18" [46 cm]).
Thread tail through remaining stitches and pull to gather. Secure end, and use remaining tail to sew side edges together for back seam.

## EARS (make 2)

With A, cast on 14 sts.
Beginning with a Right Side (knit) row, work in St st for 4 rows.

## Shape Top of Ear

Row 1 (Right Side): Ssk, knit to last 2 sts, k2tog12 sts.
Row 2: Purl.
Rows 3-10: Repeat last 2 rows 4 more times-4
sts. Note: Last row worked should be a Wrong Side (purl) row.
Row 11: K1, M1R, knit to last st, M1L, k1—6 sts.
Row 12: Purl.
Rows 13-20: Repeat last 2 rows 4 more times-14 sts. Note: Last row worked should be a Wrong Side (purl) row.
Beginning with a Right Side row (knit), work in St st for 3 rows.
Bind off as if to purl.

## SNOUT

## NOSE

With C, cast on 3 sts.
Row 1 (Right Side): Kfb, k1, kfb—5 sts.
Row 2: Pfb, p3, pfb—7 sts.
Row 3: Knit.
Row 4: P2tog, p3, ssp-5 sts.
Row 5: Ssk, k1, k2tog-3 sts.
Bind off as if to purl.

## EYES (make 2)

Make same as nose.

## FINISHING

Using photograph as a guide, position snout at center front of hat, about $13 / 4$ " ( 4 cm ) above lower edge. Whipstitch snout in place. Position nose on top of snout, centered over upper portion of snout, and whipstitch in place. Fold each ear in half across narrowest, center section and sew side edges together. Position ears on hat, 3" (8 cm) from top, on each side. Whipstitch ears in place. Position eyes above snout and whipstitch in place.
Weave in all ends.

Round 24: (K3, work Increase) around: 30 sts.
Rounds 25-38: Knit around.
Round 39: K7, place next 16 sts on holder, K7: 14
sts.
Rounds 40-50: Knit around.
Round 51: Work Increase around: 28 sts.
Rounds 52 and 53: Knit around.
Round 54: (K2, K2tog) around: 21 sts.
Round 55: (K5, K2tog) around: 18 sts.
Round 56: K3, (K2tog, K3) around: 15 sts.
Round 57: (K3, K2tog) around: 12 sts.
Round 58: (K1, K2tog) around: 8 sts.
Cut yarn, leaving a 8" $(20 \mathrm{~cm})$ end. Thread yarn

## Arms (Make 2)

With A, cast on 12 sts, leaving a long end for sewing. Join, being careful that sts are not twisted, and begin working in the round. Place marker for beginning of round.
Round 1 (Right side): Knit around.
Rounds 2-15: Knit around.
Round 16: Work Increase around: 24 sts.
Rounds 17 and 18: Knit around.
Round 19: (K2, K2tog) around: 18 sts.
Round 20: K2, (K2tog, K2) around: 14 sts.
Begin stuffing Arm with fiberfill as Rounds 21 and 22 are worked.
Round 21: K2, (K2tog, K2) around: 11 sts.
Round 22: K2, K2tog, K3, K2tog, K2: 9 sts.
Cut yarn, leaving a 8" $(20 \mathrm{~cm})$ end. Thread yarn needle with the end and weave through remaining stitches, draw up firmly; fasten securely.

## Ears (Make 2)

With A, cast on 6 sts, leaving a long end for sewing.

Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Knitting Needles: 4.5 mm [US 7]. Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Crochet Hook: 4 mm [US G]

Yarn needle, cable needle, $13 / 4$ " ( 4 cm ) toggle.

GAUGE: 25 sts = 4" (10 cm), 26 rows = 4" ( 10 cm ) in Cable Stitch. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

## Special Stitches

M1 = Make 1 (Increase) - Lift strand between needles to left-hand needle and knit strand through the back loop, twisting the stitch to prevent a hole in the fabric.
Cable (uses 4 sts) - Slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and hold in front of work, K2 from the left needle, K2 from the cable needle.

Cozy Measures 6" (15 cm) wide x 10" (25 cm) long

## E-READER COZY

## Body

Cast on 32 sts.
Row 1: Knit across.
Row 2 (Right side): Knit across.
Row 3 (Increase row): K2, (M1, K5) across: 38 sts.
Row 4: K1, (P1, K4) across to last 2 sts, P1, K1.
Row 5: P1, (K1, P4) across to last 2 sts, K1, P1.
Row 6: K1, (P1, work Cable) across to last 2 sts, P1, K1.
Row 7: P1, (K1, P4) across to last 2 sts, K1, P1.
Repeat Rows 4-7 for pattern until Body measures approximately $91 / 4^{\prime \prime}(24 \mathrm{~cm})$ from cast on edge, ending by working a right side row.

Flap

Row 1: Knit across.
Row 2 (Right side): K1, (P1, K4) across to last 2 sts, P1, K1.
Row 3: P1, (K1, P4) across to last 2 sts, K1, P1.
Row 4: K1, (P1, work Cable) across to last 2 sts, P1, K1.
Row 5: P1, (K1, P4) across to last 2 sts, K1, P1.
Rows 6-21: Repeat Rows 2-5, 4 times.
Row 22 (Decrease row): K4, (K2, K2 tog) across to last 2 sts, K2: 30 sts.
Rows 23 and 24: Knit across.
Row 25: Bind off 14 sts, slip st from right needle onto crochet hook, ch 8 (toggle loop made), slip st from crochet hook onto right needle, bind off remaining sts in knit.

## FINISHING

Thread a yarn needle with an 18" length of yarn. With right sides together and matching stitches, sew side seams. Fold over Flap for toggle placement, sew toggle to Body.

Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Circular Knitting Needles: 3.5 mm [US 4] and 3.75mm [US 5] - 16" (41 cm).
Susan Bates ${ }^{\circledR}$ Double Pointed Needles: 3.75 mm [US 5].

Yarn needle, stitch marker.

GAUGE: 50 sts = 4" (10 cm); 30 rows = 4" (10 cm) with larger needles in K3, P2 ribbing unstretched.
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

Hat directions are for Small; changes for Medium are in parentheses.

Scarf measures 4" ( 10 cm ) wide x 48" ( 122 cm ) long.
Finished Hat Circumference: 18 (20)".

## SCARF

With larger needles cast on 50 sts.
Row 1 (Right Side): * K3, p2; repeat from * across.
Row 2: * K2, p3; repeat from * across.
Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for ribbing until piece measures 48 " ( 122 cm ). Bind off in ribbing. Weave in ends.

## HAT

With smaller needle cast on 100 (110) sts; join being careful not to twist sts, place marker.
Round 1: * K3, p2; repeat from * around.
Repeat Round 1 until piece measures $1 / 1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Change to larger needle and Knit every round until $4\left(5^{1 / 2}\right)^{\prime \prime}$ from beginning.

Shape Crown
Note: Change to double point needles when there are too few sts for circular needle.

Next Round: [K8 (9), k2tog] 10 times - 90 (100) sts.
Knit 2 rounds even.
Next Round: [K7 (8), k2tog] 10 times - 80 (90) sts. Knit 2 rounds even.
Next Round: [K6 (7), k2tog] 10 times - 70 (80) sts. Knit 2 rounds even.
Next Round: [K5 (6), k2tog] 10 times - 60 (70) sts.
Knit 2 rounds even.
Next Round: [K4 (5), k2tog] 10 times - 50 (60) sts.
Knit 1 round even.
Next Round: [K3 (4), k2tog] 10 times - 40 (50) sts.
Knit 1 round even.
Next Round: [K2 (3), k2tog] 10 times - 30 (40) sts.

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Knit 1 round even.
Next Round: [K1 (2), k2tog] 10 times - 20 (30) sts.

## Medium Hat Only

Knit 1 round even.
Next Round: [K1, k2tog] 10 times - 20 sts.

Both Sizes
Next Round: [K2tog] 10 times - 10 sts.
Break yarn leaving a 12" ( 30 cm ) tail. Thread tail through remaining sts using yarn needle. Pull tight and secure. Weave in all ends.

Yarn needle.
GAUGE: 24 sts $=4$ " $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$; 22 rows $=4$ " ( 10 cm ) in ribbing. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

Finished Measurement: One size approximately 7" ( 18 cm ) around when flat. Wrister will stretch to fit most women.

## Wristers fit most women.

## Right Wrister

Cast on 38 sts. Knit 1 row. Work in ribbing as follows:
Row 1 (Right Side): K2, * p2, k2; repeat from * across.

Row 2: P2, * k2, p2; repeat from * across.
Repeat Rows 1 and 2 for ribbing until piece measures 2" ( 5 cm ) end Row 2.

Divide for Thumb (Right Side): Keeping continuity of ribbing, work across first 26 sts, bind off next 2 sts, work to end.

Next Row: Work to bind-off, cast on 2 sts, work to end.

Work even in ribbing until piece measures 8 " or desired length. Bind off all sts in ribbing loosely.

## Left Wrister

Work same as for Right Wrister EXCEPT work Divide For Thumb Row as follows: K10, bind off 2 sts, work to end.

## Finishing

Sew seams. Weave in ends.

GAUGE 28 sts = 4" (10 cm); 40 Rounds = 4" (10 cm) in St st. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needle to obtain the gauge.

## Special Abbreviation

Ssk = Slip next 2 sts knitwise, one at a time to right needle; insert point of left needle into the fronts of these 2 sts and knit them together from this position.

Finished Measurement: $2^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}(6 \mathrm{~cm})$ wide $\times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}(9$ cm ) long.

## SWEATERS

## Pattern 1

With A, cast on 20 sts and distribute among 4 double pointed needles as follows: first needle 6 sts, second needle 4 sts, third needle 6 sts, and fourth needle 4 sts. Place a marker and join, being careful not to twist sts.

Rounds 1-3: *K1, p1; repeat from * around.
Round 4: Knit.
Round 5: * [K1, p1, k1] in same st (2 sts inc), knit to end of needle; repeat from * around-28 sts.
Rounds 6-7: Knit.
Repeat last 3 rounds three times more-52 sts.

## Divide for body and sleeves

Round 17: K5 and place these sts on holder for left sleeve; k13 for back, cast on 3 sts; place next 13 sts on holder for right sleeve; k 13 for front, cast on 3 sts, knit next 8 sts and slip these sts onto holder for left sleeve.
Rounds 18-28: Working on these 32 sts for body only, knit around.
Rounds 29-32: * K1, p1; repeat from * around. Bind off.

## Left Sleeve

Round 1: Pick up and k3 sts across cast on edge of left underarm, k 13 sts from holder-16 sts.
Rounds 2-4: Knit.
Round 5: K2tog, knit around-15 sts.
Rounds 6-8: Knit.
Round 9: Ssk, knit around-14 sts.
Rounds 10-12: Knit.
Rounds 13-16: * K1, p1; repeat from * around.
Bind off.
Repeat for Right Sleeve.

## Pattern 2

Work same as for Pattern 1 as follows:
With C, work Rounds 1 - 3
Change to B, and work Rounds 4-28
Round 29: Knit.
Rounds 30-32: Work as for Pattern 1.
Change to B, work Rounds 1-12 of Left Sleeve.
Round 13: Change to $C$, knit around.

Complete same as for Pattern 1.
Repeat for Right Sleeve.

## Pattern 3

With C, work Rounds 1 - 20 same as for Pattern 1.
Round 21: Join B and begin working Fair isle pattern as follows: * K1 with C, k1 with B, k2 with C; repeat from * around.
Round 22: * K3 with B, k1 C; repeat from * around.
Round 23: Repeat Round 21.
Round 24: * K3 with C, k1 with B; repeat from * around.
Round 25: * K1 with B, k1 with C, k2 with B: repeat from * around.
Round 26: Repeat Round 24.
Rounds 27-28: Change to B, knit around.
Round 29: Change to B, knit around.
Rounds 30-32: Work as for Pattern 1.

## Left Sleeve

Work same as Pattern 1 as follows:
With C, work Rounds 1-12.
Round 13: Change to B, knit around.
Rounds 14-16: Work same as for Pattern 1.
Repeat for Right Sleeve.

## FINISHING

Weave in yarn ends.
Shape wire into hanger shapes. See actual size guide below.
