Materials:

- Any size hook
- Any worsted weight yarn

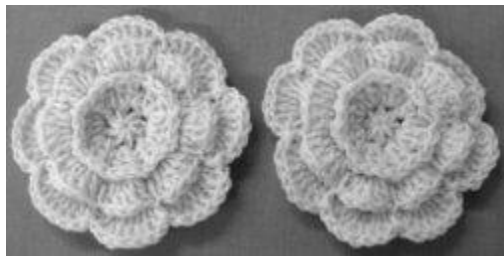
Pattern:

1. Chain 6. Do 1 slip stitch in the first chain.
2. 1SC in every chain.
3. 6SC.
4. 6SC.
5. 2SC in every SC.
6. Chain 3, 1DC in the next SC, 1DC in the next SC, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the next SC.
7. Repeat the previous row three more times until you have four leaves.

Leona Flower

A little flower can go a long way when it comes to accessories. This free crochet flower pattern forms a beautiful three-layered bloom that will spruce up any outfit, bag, or headpiece. You could even attach several Leona Flowers to a long crochet chain in order to create decorative garland.

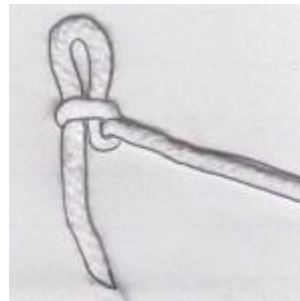
Materials:

- 4-ply knitting worsted
- I-9 crochet hook

Notes:

1) the 1st st of the ch4 should serve as a slip knot whereby as the sts are loaded the 1st is increasing in size to accommodate multiple sts being worked into it (how to make that happen: after making the slip knot for the beg ch st, be sure that the short end is to the left; that is, if the chain st is laying flat and untwisted, the short end

will be coming through the slip down and to the left. Insert hk in ch and begin sts).



2) Make sure to maintain consistent height of stitches in working multiple double crochets into one st.

3) ch3 or ch4 counts as a dc throughout.

Pattern:

1) Leaving about a 10" tail (for weaving in later w/yarn needle), ch 4 (counts as dc), 7 dc in 1st ch; pull ctr tight to draw up a circle of double crochets; sl st in top of ch4. Manipulate the piece and spread sts evenly for a nice, ROUND, circle. Sl st in sp before next dc.

2) Ch 3, 2 dc in same sp, *3 dc in next sp, rep * around; join w/sl st in top ch of beg ch 3 (24dc).

3) remove lp fr hk, insert hk fr back thru back lp of top next dc and pull lp to back of wk; ch 3, sk 2dc after the beg ch3 of rnd 2, *bk post sl st around next dc (to wk bk post sl st: insert hk fr back around dc,yo, pull thru lp on hk), ch3, sk 2 dc, rep fr * around, working last sl st in base of 1st ch3 (8 lps).

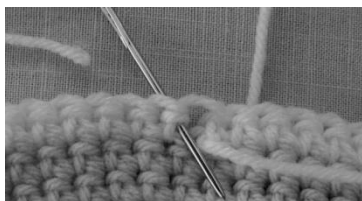
4) *5 dc in next ch 3 sp, sl st into sl st (bet petals) from previous rnd, rep fr * around; join w/sl st in sl st. **(BE SURE sl sts are MADE INTO sl sts fr last rnd).**

5) ch 4, working fr behind petals, sl st in next sl st thru both lps, rep fr * around; ending sl st in 1st sl st.

6) *7 dc in ch 4 sp, sl st into next sl st thru both lps, rep fr * around, ending sl st in 1st sl st.

HOW-TOS – Seamless Join Finish at End of Round

Use this joining method at the end of a rnd of crochet sts for a seamless join. When the last st of the rnd is worked, cut yarn leaving a 6" tail. Pull thru lp on hk maintaining st tension. Thread yarn needle; insert needle thru/under both lps of 1st st of rnd. Insert needle into ctr of last st of rnd thru to the wrong side; do not twist st; weave in tail.



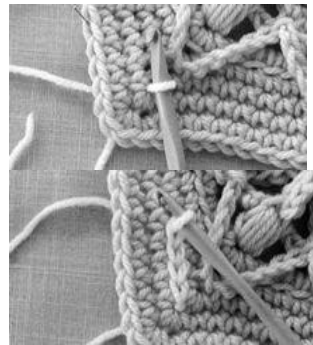
(to wk: fr post hdc: yo, insert hk in right sp made under sets of dcs, under sl sts and up thru next sp under dcs, yo/pull thru 3lps on hk), sk sl st, rep * around, ending w/fr post hdc, join to 1st sl st of rnd.

Rnd 2: Rep edge on rnd 4.

Rnd 3: Rep edge on rnd 2, working fr post dc (not hdc) around ea dc (fr rnd 1), below a sl st (inserting hk around dcs in rnd 1; [8 fr post dcs]).

Ctr: w/yellow, wk top-ch around, bringing sl st lp up thru sps between ea dc post (8sl sts).

How to top-ch st: Make 1 beg ch st. Remove lp from hk; yarn feeds from ws. Insert hk from rs to ws wherever the top-ch st should begin in a sp bet 2 sts and pull up the 1st ch st from ws; cont as est.



Weave in ends.

Optional Flower Edge in Contrasting Color

(worked tbl throughout) Rnd 1: (rs) w/contrasting color beg w/outside edge of last worked rnd, sl st in 1st dc left of a sl st, *sl st in dcs up to next sl st; wk fr post hdc

Two Simple Crocheted Flowers

Make Two Simple Crocheted Flowers with this free crochet pattern. In the instructions you will find a pattern for two five-petal flowers, one pointed and one rounded. These are easy to work up and have a cute button for the center. Attach to any item you want for a fun embellishment.

Materials:

- Worsted weight yarn
- 5.00 mm hook
- Small buttons for the center of the flowers

This pattern is written in American terms.

Abbreviations:

Ch = chain,

Sc = single crochet

Dc = double crochet

Sl st = slip stitch.

Pink flower:

Ch 6 and join with a slip stitch to make a circle.

Round 1: *Ch 5, sc in second chain from hook, dc in next three chains, sl st to join to the center of the circle,** (one petal made). Repeat from * to ** four more times.

At the end of last petal, fasten off, and weave in ends.



Orange flower:

Ch 6, join with a slip stitch to make a circle.

Round 1: *ch3, 3 dc in circle, ch3, join to the center with a slip stitch** (one petal made). Repeat from * to ** four more times.

At the end of last petal, fasten off, and weave in ends.

Sew the flowers to your project using a button in the center.

A Pink Rose Bouquet

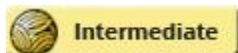

Materials:

- Yarn: Lily® Sugar 'n Cream

(Solids: 70.9 g/2.5 oz/109 m/120 yds)

(Ombres: 56.7g/2 oz/86 m/95 yds)-

Bouquet of 15 Flowers

Main Color (MC) (00144 Strawberry)

1 ball

Contrast A (00046 Rose Pink) 1ball

Contrast B (01740 Hot Pink) 1 ball

Contrast C (01712 Hot Green) 2 balls

- Crochet Hook: Size 4 mm (U.S. G or 6) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Light green floral wire

Size:

Full Flower: Approx 4 ins [10 cm] wide.

Flower Bud: Approx 2 ins [5 cm] long.

Gauge: 15 sc and 16 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].

Instructions:

FULL FLOWER

(Make 3 each with MC, A and B).

Ch 4, leaving a long end to use for gathering center closed when Rose is complete. Join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

1st rnd: Ch 1. (2 sc. 2 hdc. 2 dc. 3 tr) all in ring. Join with sl st in first sc.

2nd rnd: Working behind 1st rnd, ch 1. Sl st between first 2 sc. Ch 3. Sl st between next 2 hdc. Ch 3. Sl st between next 2 dc. Ch 3. Sl st between next 2 tr. Ch 3. Sl st after last tr. Ch 3. Join with sl st to first sc. 5 ch-3 loops.

3rd rnd: *Ch 1. (5 dc. Sl st) in next ch-3 loop. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first ch 1. 5 petals.

4th rnd: Working behind last rnd, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *Ch 5. Sl st in sp between next 2 petals. Rep from * 3 times more. Ch 5. Join with sl st in first sc. 5 ch-5 loops.

5th rnd: *Ch 1. (2 dc. 4 tr. 2 dc. Sl st) in next ch-5 loop. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first ch 1. 5 petals.

6th rnd: Working behind last rnd, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *Ch 7. Sl st in sp between next 2 petals. Rep from * 3 times more. Ch 7. Join with sl st in first sc. 5 ch-7 loops.

7th rnd: *Ch 1. (3 dc. 5 tr. 3 dc. Sl st) in next ch-7 loop. Rep from * around. Join with sl st in first ch 1. 5 petals. Fasten off.

Thread end at starting ring onto a tapestry needle and gather center tog tightly to close flower.

FLOWER BUD

(Make 2 each with MC, A and B).

With C, ch 2.

1st rnd: 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join with sl st in first sc.

2nd rnd: Ch 1. (2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc) twice. 2 sc in last sc. Join with sl st in first sc. 8 sc.

3rd rnd: Ch 1. (2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc) 4 times. Join MC, A or B with sl st in first sc. 12 sc. Break C.

4th rnd: With MC, A or B, ch 1. Working in back loop only of each sc work 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc.

5th rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st.
**Miss next sc. 5 sc in next sc – shell made.*
Miss next sc. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from * twice more. Miss next sc. Shell in next sc. Miss next sc. Join with sl st in first sc.

6th rnd: Working behind last rnd, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. *Ch 4. Sl st in sp between next 2 petals. Rep from * once more. Ch 4. Join with sl st in first sc. 3 ch-4 loops.

7th rnd: *Ch 1. (4 dc. 1 hdc. 1 sc. Sl st) in next ch-4 loop. Rep from * twice more. Join with sl st in first ch 1. Fasten off.

STEMS (make 15). With C, ch 51.

1st row: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. 50 sc. Fasten off.

LEAVES (make 30): With C, ch 5.

1st rnd: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 dc in next ch. 5 dc in last ch. Working into opposite side of ch into rem loops, 1 dc in next ch. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 sc

in last ch. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Cut floral wire in lengths to fit stems and weave through stem. Sew 2 leaves to each stem. Attach Full Flowers or Flower Buds to stem end.

5 Petal Crochet Flower

The 5 Petal Crochet Flower is a super cute crochet design with a double layer. This crocheted flower can be turned into a button or a pin and can even be attached to a plain headband. The possibilities are endless.

Materials:

- G size (4.25 mm) crochet hook
- Small amount of cotton or acrylic worsted weight yarn.
- Yarn needle
- Pin or Barrette

Abbreviations, in US terms:

ch = chain stitch

sc = single crochet

sl st = slip stitch

hdc = half double crochet stitch

dc = double crochet stitch

Magic Ring: Wrap yarn around 2 fingers as if to start with a chain, pull up a loop, but do not tighten. Yarn over, and secure a chain stitch on hook. Work Round 1 stitches into ring then pull tight.

*Note: If you intend on attaching a pin or barrette to the flower, I recommend leaving a long tail before you start, and using the tail to secure the pin/barrette once the flower is complete.

Round 1: Start with a magic ring. 5 sc in the ring. Join with sl st to first sc, pull tight.

Round 2: *Ch 3, sl st in next sc*. Repeat from * 4 more times. The last sl st will be in the sc you started with. You should have 5 loops.

Round 3: Work (sc, hdc, 3 dc, hdc, sc) in each ch-3 space.

Round 4: * Ch 5, working behind the first set of petals, sl st in the back of the sc from Round 2*. Repeat from * 4 more times, with the last sl st at the beginning of the first ch-5.

Round 5: Work (sc, hdc, 5 dc, hdc, sc) in ch-5 space. Join with a sl st in first sc of round.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

This picture is my attempt to show where to make the slip stitch after the 5 ch in Round 4. This is the back of the flower, with the white section being the back of the sc stitch from Round 2.

Triple Layer Crochet Flower

Learn how to crochet flowers with this cute Triple Layer Crochet Flower. Add it to any crochet design as an embellishment. Turn it into a barrette or a pin or put it on your favorite bag. This is an easy crochet pattern to work up and would look amazing in different colors or a variegated yarn.



Triple Layer Crochet Flower

Materials:

- 4.0mm hook
- Caron's Simply Soft
- Tapestry needle for weaving in ends

Pattern:

Chain 5, 4 triple crochet into first stitch on chain, chain 4, slip stitch into first stitch on chain, Repeat 4 more times to create 5 petals. *Be sure to stitch into first stitch of each chain and not into the center of flower as it is being created. (this pattern can also

be transformed into a bow- two petals with yarn wrapped around center. Or a 3-4 leafed clover- just make 3-4 petals and add a stem)



It will get a little tricky holding it all together for the first couple times you make this flower but I promise you it will all come together nicely.

From front to back insert hook into loop of first petal and slip stitch, continue to slip stitch all the way around through each petal and finish by slip stitching into first slip stitch in center.



Pull up on loop and pull out hook leaving loop. Insert hook from back to front through hole in center, pull loop through and secure between set of petals with a slip stitch.

Pretty Flowers to Crochet: Brightly Colored Crochet Flower Patterns



Chain 6 and slip stitch between next set of petals, repeat all the way around back of flower. (5 chain loops)



Into the first loop- *slip stitch, chain 4, 5 triple crochet, chain 4, slip stitch- Repeat from * 4 more times to create 5 petals. Slip stitch into the base of 1st petal to complete round.



Secure loop between set of petals with slip stitch and create a chain 6 loop behind each petal.

Into the first loop- *slip stitch, chain 4, 6 triple crochet, chain 4, slip stitch- Repeat from * 4 more times to create 5 petals. Slip stitch into the base of 1st petal to complete round.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



Double Layer Crocheted Flower

Single, double and treble crochet stitches are used with this free crochet pattern. Make a beautiful double layer crocheted flower. Crochet in the round for a fast and easy crochet pattern.

Materials:

- Small amounts of worsted weight yarn
- H crochet hook
- Yarn needle for finishing off
- Something to embellish

Abbreviations:

Ch-chain

SC-single crochet

DC-double crochet

TC-treble crochet

SISl-slip stitch

BPSC- Back Post Single Crochet

You'll be crocheting in rounds. Don't turn work. Work through both loops for this pattern.

Let me just make a suggestion! Before you get scared reading about the back post double crochet, pull out a hook and some yarn and just give it a try. It really is easier than it reads.

Pattern:

Chain 2.

Round 1: Work 10 SC into the second chain from hook. SISl in the top of the first SC. (Change color after this round if you'd like a different color center). Gently pull tail to tighten.

Round 2: *ch 2, skip 1 SC, SC in next stitch* Complete four times. ch 2, skip 1 SC, SISl in the first chain 2 space to join. (total of 5 chain 2 spaces)

Round 3: Ch 1, HDC,DC,2 TC, DC, HDC, SISl in the same ch 2 space. *Ch 1, HDC,DC,2 TC, DC, HDC, SISl* in each remaining chain 2 space. You will have 5 petals when you finish this round.

Round 4: Ch 1, *BPSC around the post of the SC on round 2. CH 3.* Complete 5 times. Sl stitch in the first BPSC to make the last ch 3 space.

Round 5: *SISl, Ch 1, HDC,DC, 3 TC, DC, HDC, SISl* in each ch 3 space. You should now have a second row of petals behind the first.

The 5 Minute Flower

As the name states, you can use this free crochet pattern to make a 5 minute flower; it doesn't get much better than that. Add flowers to any kind of pattern like a plain bag or hat.

Materials:

- Hook: Any
- Yarn: Any
- Needle and Thread
- Button

Pattern:

Ch 4, sl st into 1st ch to form a ring.

ROUND 1: *2 sc in next chain, ch, 1 sc in next ch* rep from * 1 more time. (6 st)

ROUND 2: *working in same stitch, sl st in next sc, ch 1, 2 dc, ch 1, sl st* rep from * 5 more times. (6 petals)

FINISHING: After last sl st, cut yarn leaving long tail. Work tail to backside of flower and fasten off.

Sew on a button.

Sweet Crochet Flower

Make this Sweet Crochet Flower to add some happy color to your life. Free crochet flower patterns are great for sprucing up sweaters, headbands, and bags. Pin one onto something before you walk out the door today.

Materials:

- (8-ply) yarn small amount any colour
- Crochet hook size 3.0mm
- Sewing yarn needle
- Removable stitch markers or contrasting coloured yarn

Skill and abbreviations:

You will need to know how to make:

Chain (ch)

Slip stitch (sl st)

Single crochet (sc)

Magic ring or adjustable ring

double crochet

Note:

1. In this pattern, you will work in the round continuously. You may use a removable stitch marker or a short piece of yarn of contrasting colour to mark the beginning of each round. At the end of each round, you will not join, but begin the next round in the next stitch.
2. The stitch counts at the end of each round are given.

Pattern:

Round1. Make magic ring or adjustable ring and 8sc in ring (8sts) body colour

Round2. *Sc in next st, 2sc in next st*, repeat from * around (16sts) body colour

Round3. *Sc in next, 4dc, skip next st, sc in next* and repeat 4times, fasten off. Petals (do not need to count st in this round)

Stashbuster Spring Flowers

These Stashbuster Spring Flowers are quick and simple to work up using any color yarn you have in your stash. This easy crochet pattern can be added to a variety of projects including headbands, hats, totes, and more. It's the perfect embellishment for springtime patterns. Make a handful of flowers in different colors and give Mom a homemade bouquet for Mother's Day that she can enjoy forever.



Stashbuster Spring Flowers

Materials:

- F-3.75 MM Crochet Hook
- Caron Simply Soft medium weight yarn
- Yarn needle for weaving in ends

Stitches:

Magic Ring
Ch-Chain
HDC- Half Double Crochet
TR- Treble Crochet
Slip Stitch

Pattern:

Round 1: Magic Ring, CH 1, 10 HDC into magic ring, Pull ring tight, Join to top of first HDC. (10 stitches)

Round 2: **Slip stitch into next stitch.{{CH 2, TR, CH 2, HDC, CH 2, TR }} All in one stitch. CH 2, Slip stitch into same stitch, Slip stitch into next stitch. Repeat from ** 4 MORE times.

Finish off, Pull end through flower to the other side (the back of the flower)

Change Colors (attaching yarn into the bottom of a heart petal)

You will now slip stitch around the petals-- Directions are below as Round 3

TIP: When slip stitching, slip stitch in the back loop only. When slip stitching into the center of the HDC you will be slip stitching into the part the HDC that you pulled through all 3 loops when making the HDC--- and remember, the slip stitch you do after the slip stitch into the HDC is a little tight, do not miss it!

Round 3: **Slip stitch into both chains of CH 2. Slip stitch into the TR, Slip stitch into each chain of the CH 2. Slip stitch into the center of the HDC, Slip stitch into both chains of CH 2. Slip stitch into the TR. Slip stitch into both chains of CH 2. Slip stitch into starting stitch (bottom of heart) Slip stitch into the bottom of the next heart. Repeat from ** around 4 more times. Finish off, Pull end through flower to the other side (the back of the flower) Weave in your ends!

Crochet Flower Garland

This Crochet Flower Garland is a super cute idea for Spring if you're looking for something to do with crochet flower patterns. Decorate your windows and get ready for curious neighbors!

Materials Needed:

- Size I crochet hook
- Scrap yarn in desired colors

Abbreviations:

ch = chain
hdc = half-double crochet
dc = double crochet
st = stitch
sl st = slip stitch
sp = space
rem = remaining
rep = repeat
beg = beginning

Pattern:

Ch 4, join with sl st to form a ring.

ROW 1

Ch 1, work 9 sc in ring, join with sl st to beg ch 1.

ROW 2

Ch 3, work 2 dc inst at bottom of ch, sl st in next ch, *work 3 dc in next ch, sl st in next ch *, rep from * to * 3 more times. 5 petals made.

You can stop there if you want teeny tiny flowers, or you can continue with another round to make the petals fuller, as follows:

ROW 3

Sc in next st, hdc in same sp, work 3 dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in same st, sl st in sl st from previous row, * sc in next st, hdc in same sp, work 3 dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in same st, sl st in sl st from previous row *, rep from * to * 3 more times. Fasten off. Weave in ends.



GARLAND

Ch 25, * sl st in top of one petal of flower, ch 15 *, rep from * to * until all flowers are joined, ch 25, Fasten off.
