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4th of July Beach Bag

By: Lily Sugar 'n Cream

Make a red, white, and blue splash this summer with a 4th of July beach bag. You can create your very own using this free crochet pattern. Put your beach towel, flip flops, sunglasses, and sun screen all in this bag.



Crochet Hook: H/8 or 5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Yarn: Lily® Sugar'n Cream (Solids 70.9 g/2.5 oz/109 m/120 yds)

Contrast A (00001 White) 6 balls

Contrast B (00095 Red) 5 balls

Contrast C (00028 Delft Blue) 6 balls

or Lily® Sugar'n Cream (Ombres 56.7 g/2 oz/86 m/95 yds)

Contrast A 7 balls

Contrast B 6 balls

Contrast C 7 balls

- Yarn: Size 5 mm (U.S.H or 8) crochet hook **or size needed to obtain gauge.**

Size: 15 ins [38 cm] wide x 8 ins [20.5 cm] deep x 16 ins [40.5 cm] high.

Gauge: 12 dc and 6 rows using 2 strands of yarn tog = 4 ins [10 cm].

Instructions:

Note: To change color, work to last 2 loops on hook. Draw loop of next color through 2 loops on hook to complete st and proceed in next color.

Stripe Pat

With A, work 2 rows.

With B, work 2 rows.

With A, work 2 rows.

With C, work 2 rows.

These 8 rows form Stripe Pat.

FRONT and BACK PANELS (Make 2)

With 2 strands of C held tog, ch 49.

****1st row:** 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each of next 3 ch. *1 hdc in next ch. 1 dc in each of next 2 ch. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 sc in each of next 8 ch. Rep from * to last 8 ch. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 dc in each of next 2 ch. 1 hdc in next ch. 1 sc in each of next 4 ch. Turn.

2nd row: Ch 3. 1 dc in first sc (counts as 2 dc). *1 dc in each of next 3 sc. (Yoh and draw up a loop in next st. Yoh and draw a loop through 2 loops on hook) twice. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook - Dc2tog made. Dc2tog over next 2 sts. 1 dc in each of next 3 sc. (2 dc in next sc) twice. Rep from *, ending with: 2 dc in next sc. Join A. Turn.

3rd row: With A, ch 1. 2 sc in first dc. *1 sc in each of next 3 dc. *Draw up a loop in each of next 2 sts. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook -* Sc2tog made. Sc2tog over next 2 sts. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. (2 sc in next dc) twice. Rep from *, ending with 2 sc in top of turning ch. Turn.**

First 3 rows of Stripe Pat are completed.

Keeping cont of Stripe Pat, rep last 2 rows until work from beg measures approx 14 ins [35.5 cm], ending with 2 rows of B.

Next row: With A, ch 1. 2 sc in first dc. *1 sc in each of next 3 dc. (Sc2tog over next 2 sts) twice. 1 sc in each of

next 3 dc. Ch 4. Miss next 2 dc. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. (Sc2tog over next 2 sts) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc.* 2 sc in each of next 2 dc. Rep from * to * once more. 2 sc in top of turning ch. Turn.

Next row: Ch 3. 1 dc in first sc (counts as 2 dc). *1 dc in each of next 3 sc. (Dc2tog over next 2 sts) twice. 1 dc in each of next 2 sts. 6 dc in next ch-4 sp. 1 dc in each of next 2 sts. (Dc2tog over next 2 sts) twice. 1 dc in each of next 3 sc. *2 dc in each of next 2 sc. Rep from * to * once more. 2 dc in last sc. Join C. Turn.

Work a further 2 rows in pat. Fasten off.

Side Panels (Make 2).

With 2 strands of C tog, ch 37.

Work from ** to ** as given for Front and Back Panels. Cont in Stripe Pat until work from beg measures 16 ins [40.5 cm]. Fasten off.

Join Panels: Arrange Panels to form a rectangle, having Side Panels opposite each other. With WS of 2 Panels tog, join 2 strands of B with sl st to top left corner. Ch 1. Working through both thicknesses, work 1 row of sc evenly along side edge. Fasten off. Rep for rem Panels.

Base: With 2 strands of C, ch 49.

1st row: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. Turn. 48 sc.

2nd row: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc across. Turn.

Rep last row until work from beg measures 12 ins [30.5 cm], ending with a WS row. Do not fasten off.

Join Base to Panels: With RS of Base facing, place lower edge of joined Panels

behind Base with WS of work tog, aligning corners of Base with joining rows of Panels.

Next rnd: Ch 1. Working through both thicknesses, work 1 rnd of sc evenly around all 4 sides of Base. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

Top edging: With RS of work facing, join 2 strands of B with sl st to any corner of top edge. Ch 1. Working from left to right instead of right to left as usual, work 1 rnd of reverse sc evenly around top edge. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

Handles (Make 2).

With 2 strands of B, ch 95 loosely.

1st row: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. Turn. 94 sc.

2nd row: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn.

Rep last row once more. Fasten off.

With RS of Tote facing, push ends of Handle through slits of Front Panel to WS. Sew ends tog. Bring halves of Handle tog and taking 2 strands of A tog, wrap center 4 ins [10 cm] of Handle as shown in picture. Fasten ends securely. Rep for Back Panel.

Crochet Hook: G/6 or 4 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

Hook Size G
Red Heart Super Saver
Safety Pin

Stitches Used: ch, sc.

Difficulty: EASY

Instructions:

Row 1: With Red, Ch 30, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across.

Row 2: Attach White, sc in each st.

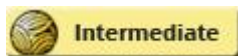
Row 3: Attach Blue, sc in each st.

Finishing: With ribbon positioned as in the photo above, attach the safety pin through both thicknesses.

A July 4th Crochet Afghan

Support that red, white and blue by crocheting this fabulous 4th of July afghan. Bring it with you to the parade so you can display your patriotism.



Crochet Hook: I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Size I crochet hook
- Caron International's Simply Soft 24 oz. White (Color A), 24 oz. Dark Country Blue (Color B), 15 oz. Red (Color C).

Instructions:

STRIPED BLOCKS: (Make 10) With Red, ch 39.

1. Row 1: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sc in ea ch across, turn.
2. Row 2: Ch 1, 1 sc in ea st across, turn.
3. Row 3: Rep row 2 keeping in pattern, work 3 rows White, 3 rows Red, alternately until there are 13 stripes. Fasten off.
4. Attach Royal at the top left hand corner and ch 3, work dc in ea row along side edge, work (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in corner, dc in ea st along bottom edge, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in corner, dc in ea row along side edge, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in corner, dc in ea st across top, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in corner, join with a sl st in the 3rd ch of beg ch 3. Fasten off.
5. Weave in yarn ends.

STAR BLOCKS: (Make 10) With Royal, ch 39.

1. Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and sc in ea ch across, ch 1, turn. Complete chart. Fasten off. With Royal, work 1 rnd dc around block the same as for

striped block. Weave in yarn ends.

2. Sew blocks tog. With Royal, work 1 rnd dc around having 1 dc in ea st along top, bottom and sides and (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in the ch 1 st at corners. Fasten off. Weave in yarn ends.
3. Fringe: Cut one 24" strand ea, Red, Royal and White and holding ends tog, attach in the first st, * sk 2 sts and attach 3 strands in the next st, rep across. Attach fringe at the opposite end.

4th of July Potholders

Crochet a fabulous pair of 4th of July potholders to celebrate the holiday. This free crochet pattern comes with four variations of the potholder. Make one or make them all.



Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: One Size

Set of 4, each about 8 1/2 x 8 1/2 in.
(21.5 x 21.5 cm)

Materials:

- 830-148 Cotton-Ease: Turquoise (A) (one ball)
- 830-113 Cotton-Ease: Cherry (B) (one ball)

- 830-099 Cotton-Ease: Almond (C) (one ball)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size G-hook
Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

GAUGE:

18 sc + 17 rows = 4 in. (10 cm). **BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in. [10 cm] square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

NOTES:

1. Yarn quantities listed are sufficient to make all four potholders.
2. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Do not fasten off old color. Leave old color on WS of work until next needed.
3. Use a separate ball of yarn for each section of color.
4. Wind A into 2 separate balls, and wind B and C each into 3 separate balls before beginning.
5. Potholders can be made by

following the written instructions or reading the Charts.

6. When working from chart, read RS rows from right to left, and WS rows from left to right.

POTHOLDER #1 - NINE PATCH WITH A AND C

With A, ch 37.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 11 ch; change to C, sc in next 12 ch; change to A, sc in last 12 ch - 36 sc at the end of this row.

Rows 2-11: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in last 12 sc.

Row 12: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in last 12 sc; change to C in last sc.

Rows 13-23: With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to A, sc in next 12 sc; change to C, sc in last 12 sc.

Row 24: With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to A, sc in next 12 sc; change to C, sc in last 12 sc; change to A in last sc.

Rows 25-36: Rep Row 2 twelve times.

Edging: With A, ch 1, sc evenly around 4 sides of Potholder, working 2 sc in each corner; at end of rnd, ch 10 for hanging loop; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

POTHOLDER #2 - NINE PATCH WITH B AND C

With B, ch 37.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 11 ch; change to C, sc in next 12 ch; change to B, sc in last 12 ch - 36 sc at the end of this row.

Rows 2-11: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in last 12 sc.

Row 12: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in last 12 sc; change to C in last sc.

Rows 13-23: With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 12 sc; change to C, sc in last 12 sc.

Row 24: With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 12 sc; change to C, sc in last 12 sc; change to B in last sc.

Rows 25-36: Rep Row 2 twelve times.

Edging: With B, ch 1, sc evenly around 4 sides of Potholder, working 2 sc in each corner; at end of rnd, ch 10 for hanging loop; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

POTHOLDER #3 - PATCHWORK

With A, ch 37.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 10 ch; change to B, sc in next ch; change to C, sc in next 12 ch; change to B, sc in next ch; change to

A, sc in last 11 ch - 36 sc at the end of this row.

Row 2: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 10 sc; change to B, sc in next 2 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 2 sc; change to A, sc in last 10 sc.

Row 3: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 9 sc; change to B, sc in next 3 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 3 sc; change to A, sc in last 9 sc.

Row 4: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 8 sc; change to B, sc in next 4 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 4 sc; change to A, sc in last 8 sc.

Row 5: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 7 sc; change to B, sc in next 5 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 5 sc; change to A, sc in last 7 sc.

Row 6: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 6 sc; change to B, sc in next 6 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 6 sc; change to A, sc in last 6 sc.

Row 7: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 5 sc; change to B, sc in next 7 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 7 sc; change to A, sc in last 5 sc.

Row 8: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 4 sc; change to B, sc in next 8 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 8 sc; change to A, sc in last 4 sc.

Row 9: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 3 sc; change to B, sc in next 9 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 9 sc; change to A, sc in last 3 sc.

Row 10: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 2 sc; change to B, sc in next 10 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 10 sc; change to A, sc in last 2 sc.

Row 11: With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first sc; change to B, sc in next 11 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 11 sc; change to A, sc in last sc; change to B in last sc.

Row 12: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in last 12 sc; change to C in last sc.

Rows 13-23: With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 12 sc; change to C, sc in last 12 sc.

Row 24: With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to B, sc in next 12 sc; change to C, sc in last 12 sc; change to B in last sc.

Row 25: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in last 12 sc; change to A in last sc.

Row 26: Rep Row 11.

Row 27: Rep Row 10.

Row 28: Rep Row 9.

Row 29: Rep Row 8.

Row 30: Rep Row 7.

Row 31: Rep Row 6.

Row 32: Rep Row 5.

Row 33: Rep Row 4.
Row 34: Rep Row 3.
Row 35: Rep Row 2.
Row 36: With A, sc in first 11 sc;
change to B, sc in next sc; change to
C, sc in next 12 sc; change to B, sc in
next sc; change to A, sc in last 11 sc.
Edging: With A, ch 1, sc evenly
around 4 sides of Potholder, working
2 sc in each corner; at end of rnd, ch
10 for hanging loop; join with sl st in
first sc.
Fasten off.

With B, ch 37.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook
and in each ch across - 36 sc at the
end of this row.

Row 2: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first
12 sc; change to C, sc in next sc;
change to B, sc in next 10 sc; change
to C, sc in next sc; change to B, sc in
last 12 sc.

Row 3: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first
12 sc; change to C, sc in next 2 sc;
change to B, sc in next 8 sc; change to
C, sc in next 2 sc; change to B, sc in
last 12 sc.

Row 4: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first
12 sc; change to C, sc in next 3 sc;
change to B, sc in next 6 sc; change to
C, sc in next 3 sc; change to B, sc in
last 12 sc.

Row 5: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first

12 sc; change to C, sc in next 4 sc;
change to B, sc in next 4 sc; change to
C, sc in next 4 sc; change to B, sc in
last 12 sc.

Row 6: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first
12 sc; change to C, sc in next 5 sc;
change to B, sc in next 2 sc; change to

12 sc; change to C, sc in next 5 sc;
change to A, sc in next 2 sc; change to

12 sc; change to C, sc in next 4 sc;
change to A, sc in next 4 sc; change to

12 sc; change to C, sc in next 3 sc;
change to A, sc in next 6 sc; change to

12 sc; change to C, sc in next 2 sc;
change to A, sc in next 8 sc; change to

12 sc; change to C, sc in next sc;
change to A, sc in next 10 sc; change

Row 12: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first
12 sc; change to A, sc in next 12 sc;
change to B, sc in last 12 sc.

Row 13: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first sc; change to C, sc in next 10 sc; change to A, sc in next sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in next sc; change to C, sc in next 10 sc; change to B, sc in last sc.

Row 14: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 2 sc; change to C, sc in next 8 sc; change to A, sc in next 2 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in next 2 sc; change to C, sc in next 8 sc; change to B, sc in last 2 sc.

Row 15: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 3 sc; change to C, sc in next 6 sc; change to A, sc in next 3 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in next 3 sc; change to C, sc in next 6 sc; change to B, sc in last 3 sc.

Row 16: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 4 sc; change to C, sc in next 4 sc; change to A, sc in next 4 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in next 4 sc; change to C, sc in next 4 sc; change to B, sc in last 4 sc.

Row 17: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 5 sc; change to C, sc in next 2 sc; change to A, sc in next 5 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in next 5 sc; change to C, sc in next 2 sc; change to B, sc in last 5 sc.

Rows 18 and 19: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 6 sc; change to A, sc in next 6 sc; change to C, sc in next 12 sc; change to A, sc in next 6 sc; change to B, sc in last 6 sc.

Row 20: Rep Row 17.

Row 21: Rep Row 16.

Row 22: Rep Row 15.

Row 23: Rep Row 14.

Row 24: Rep Row 13.

Row 25: Rep Row 12.

Row 26: Rep Row 11.

Row 27: Rep Row 10.

Row 28: Rep Row 9.

Row 29: Rep Row 8.

Row 30: Rep Row 7.

Row 31: Rep Row 6.

Row 32: Rep Row 5.

Row 33: Rep Row 4.

Row 34: Rep Row 3.

Row 35: Rep Row 2.

Row 36: With B, sc in each sc across.

Edging: With B, ch 1, sc evenly around 4 sides of Pothead, working 2 sc in each corner; at end of rnd, ch 10 for hanging loop; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

Stars and Stripes Cushions

Our free crochet patterns are a perfect way to get into the 4th of July spirit. These stars and stripes cushions are a great way to decorate your living room for your 4th cookout. People will be asking you where you got them!



Crochet Hook: H/8 or 5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Yarn: Lily® Sugar'n Cream® (70.9 g / 2.5 oz) Quantity for 4

cushions.

Color A - #00095 Red 5¾ oz [160 g]; 272 yds [247 m] or 3 balls

Color B - #00001 White 5¾ oz [160 g]; 272 yds [247 m] or 3 balls

Color C - #00009 Bright Navy 25½ oz [723 g]; 1230 yds [1114 m] or 11 balls

- Crochet Hook: Size 5 mm (U.S. H or 8) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Four 16 ins [40.5 cm] square pieces of 1 inch [2.5 cm] thick foam

Size: Approx 16 ins [40.5 cm] square.

Gauge: 13 dc and 7 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].

Instructions:

Note: Ch 3 at beg of row counts as dc. To change color, work to last 2 loops on hook at end of row. With new color, draw through 2 loops on hook, then proceed.

FRONT (make 4): With A, ch 54.

1st row: 1 dc in 4th ch from hook (counts as 2 dc). 1 dc in each ch to end of ch. Turn. 52 dc.

2nd row: Ch 3. 1 dc in each dc to end of row. Join B. Turn.

3rd and 4th rows: With B, as 2nd

row. Join A at end of 4th row. Turn.

5th and 6th rows: With A, as 2nd row. Join B at end of 6th row.

Rep last 4 rows once more, then 3rd and 4th rows once.

13th row: With A, ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 26 dc. With C, 1 dc in each dc to end of row. Turn.

14th row: With C, ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 24 dc. With A, 1 dc in each dc to end of row. Join B. Turn.

15th row: With B, ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 26 dc. With C, 1 dc in each dc to end of row. Turn.

16th row: With C, ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 24 dc. With B, 1 dc in each dc to end of row. Join A. Turn.

Rep last 4 rows twice more, then 13th and 14th rows once, omitting color change at end of 14th row. Fasten off.

With RS facing, join C with sl st to any corner of Front. Ch 1. Work in sc around 4 sides of Front, having 3 sc in corners. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

BACK (make 4): With C, ch 54.

1st row: 1 dc in 4th ch from hook (counts as 2 dc). 1 dc in each ch to end of ch. Turn. 52 dc.

2nd row: Ch 3. 1 dc in each dc to end of row. Turn.

Rep last row until Back measures same length as Front. Fasten off.

With RS facing, join C with sl st to any corner of Back. Ch 1. Work in sc around 4 sides of Back, having 3 sc in corners. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

Finishing:

With WS of Front and Back tog, join C with sl st to any corner. Working through both thicknesses, work in sc around 3 sides of Cushion, having 3 sc in corners. Insert foam piece. Work in sc across 4th side of cushion closed. Join with sl st in first sc.

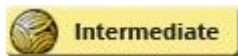

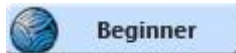
